That being said, there are some expenditures required that are necessary to comply with legislated requirements. We are currently in the process of initiating the installation of new storage facilities for pesticides and fertilizer which will cost the Club approx. \$50,000.

The removal of the elevator and installation of a barrier free ramp is scheduled to be completed by mid-December. The cost of this project is still being negotiated; however, we are confident that Base Fund will pick up the expenditure.
