PASSENGER ASSISTANCE ALARMS For Fire Harassment, Illness, Accident, Passenger Safety and Vandalism, EMERGENCY STOP DEVICE Located at cab ends of the train cars (Donotuseintunnel)



Features on Platforms

DWAs are located on all Subway ar SRT platforms, for passenger safet and convenience. Look for DWA signs and the high intensity lighting



Features on Buses REQUEST STOP PROGRAM Allows women travelling alone on buses between 9:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. to ask

the driver to let them get off the bus at locations between the regular TTC stops.

SUBWAY EVACUATION PROCEDURES

If an emergency occurs, follow these simple steps:



Listen for announcements. Follow the instructions of TTC employees and emergency response personnel. Remain calm.



Leave large objects behind, this includes parcels, bicycles, strollers and other wheeled devices.



Help those who need it. During the evacuation, During the evacuation, help children, and people who are elderly or disabled.



The train crew will direct you through the cars of the train and out to an emergency exit. Be alert for tripping hazards.



If evacuation through the train is not possible, use the Emergency Door Opening Device located above the door behind the operator s cab or every door in the SRT.
