Susie Doe (15 DEC 1902) ordered it in 1920 from Sears and Roebuck for \$125. It was shipped knock downed (unassembled) in crates to Southern Pacific Depot in Harwood. From there the crates were hauled by wagon to the Doe Ranch five miles south of Harwood.

Susie, who was teaching in the Rock Water Hole School, and brother Ed, who worked on the railroad, and another brother Jesse assembled it in their spare time from directions included. Two years later Susie bought a Ford car in Luling and gave the buggy to her father, C. O. Doe. As he had never learned to drive a car, he used the buggy for years.

After Susie married, she and her husband John Green had six little boys: Allen, Reuben, John, Elton, Aubrey, and Dale (all living at the time Susie sent us this article).
