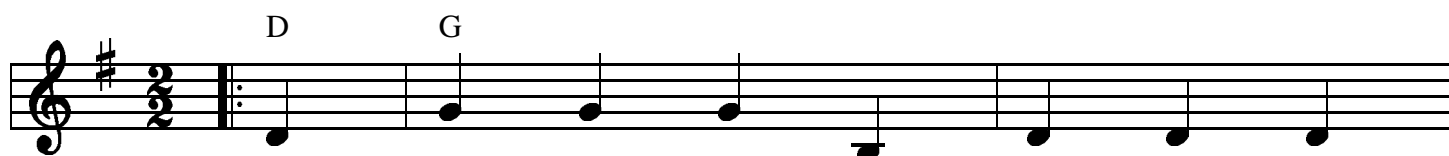


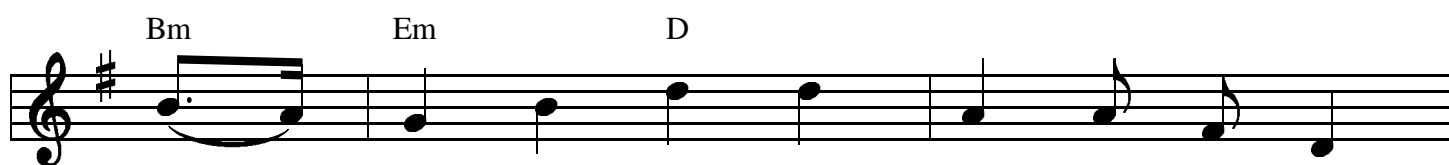
As I Walked Out One May Morning



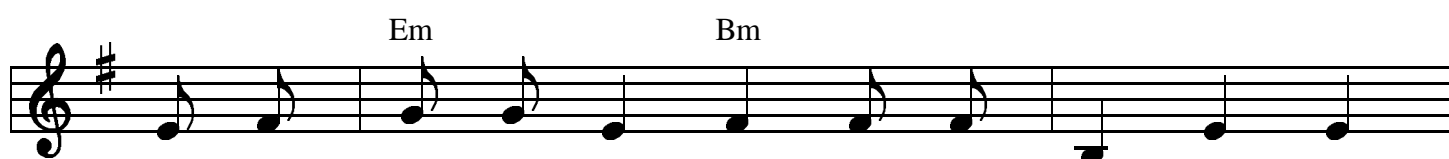
1. As I walked out one May morn - ing,
