## Dear Parents Cub and Scouts

## What lies ahead for us all during 2005?

The Scouts are all assured of at least 2 patrol hikes and 2 patrol camps during the year as well as a number of troop activities including our community Service project for the year and the great expedition hike.

The Cubs have 2 camps as well as 2 day hikes for the year as well as our community service project and various district competitions.

The Cub and Scout programme is a very carefully design programme planned to develop all the Cubs and Scouts physically, emotionally, socially and morally. All the activities and events have been planned and designed to ensure advancement and development of every Cub and Scout. However to get the most possible out of the programme, you will need to **dedicate** yourselves to your own progress and attend as many activities and events as possible. We do understand that not everyone is available for every activity, but unfortunately the Cubs and Scouts who do not attend Friday night meetings regularly and who do not support the weekend activities will not be able to advance as fast as those who do attend.

The majority of the Cub advancement programme is handled on a Friday night, but many of the outdoor activities cannot be handled in the 2 hours on Friday and are done at weekend day activities and camps.

For Scouts, however, weekend hikes and camps are essential for advancement past Pathfinder. Most of the activities are outdoor skills which are impossible to undertake on a Friday night. Friday night meetings handle basic skills training and team building tasks.

All our activities are, however, designed to be FUN.

## Parent Consent Forms

A parent consent form that is required for **ALL** activities which take place outside the hall grounds. No Cub or Scout will be allowed to participate in any of these "outside" events if they do not have this form correctly filled in and signed.

You will find a master copy of this form in this Campfire Chatter. Please assist us by making copies for your child. As our numbers grow it costs us more and more to keep copies of this form to hand out at each event.

## Uniforms

All Cubs, Scouts and recruits are expected to have at least a notebook and pencil / pen in their pockets on a Friday night. Invested Cub 9 years and older are required to carry an emergency kit in their pockets. Inspections are done on a regular basis, so don't get caught out!!!!

All invested Cubs and Scouts are required to wear official uniform on Friday nights unless stipulated otherwise. This too gets inspected regularly so look after your uniform and arrive neat and tidy on a Friday night!

All uniformed Cubs and Scouts are required to wear either school shoes or hiking boots, Brown and black only. NO TAKKIES ALLOWED!

Recruits are required to wear closed shoes. **Please NO** open toed shoes or slip-ons. This is for **your** safety.

## **Meeting Times :**

Cubs: 17h15- 19h15

Scouts: 19h30 – 21h30

Please note that the time given is the time of the opening ceremony, and Cubs and Scouts should arrive a few minutes earlier in order to get ready. Should you be late in arriving, please wait outside the hall until after the opening ceremony and inspection, and then report to the Scouter in charge.

Please ensure that you are on time for other activities as well. By being late you make the activity run short for everyone. We do however understand that things do happen and you may run late, but please make every effort to be on time.

Please also excuse yourself should you not be able to attend any function or meeting. Cubs can excuse themselves to any of the Scouters. Scouts can also excuse themselves to any of the Scouters or their PL.

## **Recruitment :**

The pack is growing rapidly which is wonderful to see. Remember that you can earn your Recruiters badge for getting one Scout or Cub to join and be invested. And if you get 5 Cubs / Scouts to join, you will earn a gold recruiters badge. The challenge is on!!

## **Badges and Advancement**

All Cubs and Scouts are responsible for their own advancement. If work is sent home it is the responsibility of the Cub / Scout to ensure that this gets returned to the Scouters. All Cubs and Scouts are welcome to arrange extra testing and instruction with any of the Scouters. All you need to do is phone one of the Scouters and make the arrangements.

All Cubs and Scouts are invited to do as many interest badges as they like.

Look in your Cub trail for the list of badges and the requirements. Chat to the Scouters about these badges. Some of the Cub interest badges can be passed of by parents, but many will need to be passed off by a Scouter or and external badge examiner. Talk to Aqua *before* you start on a badge to check who your examiner will be.

All of the Scout interest and Scoutcraft badges are examined by the Scouters or and external badge examiner. Each patrol has a copy of the badge book which can be used during Scouts meetings. Talk to Rana when you start working on a badge.

## **Parent Involvement**

1st Walmer Scout Group is a family and we need all of you to run smoothly. There are numerous ways that you can assist and support us. Firstly and most importantly we need your commitment to pay subscriptions regularly. This money is used for the basic running of the hall, Pack and Troop, including admin costs, badges and capitation fees.

Capitation fees to the Area Office have gone up this year as Area is also struggling, having not raised capitation fees in the past 5 years or so. Eastern Cape still has the lowest capitation fees in SA. These are paid on a quarterly basis to Area, and Area in turn contributes to National capitation. (So your money goes a very long way!)

We also need your support in getting your son or daughter to the various activities and events on time. Please note that most camps have a closing date for entry form and fees, please try and get your money in **before** this date. This assists us as we have to work out catering and do shopping, book and pay for venue etc and cannot handle last minute entries.

There are various parent-based events during the year, like fundraising, work parties etc where we need your help. The hall belongs to the group and as a group we need to look after it. We have 2 Committee Work parties planned for the year. Please support us by being there with your mop and tools etc.

Fundraising is a never-ending task. We know you really get hammered from every quarter about this, but unfortunately, as with the schools, we also need money to stay afloat. Please support and assist with our fundraisers. We recently had a wonderful Trivia Evening. Thanks a lot to all who supported that. It was a great show of team work and fun was really had by all... and we made quite a bit of money too! And it is nice to know that this event has been taken over by a parent for 2005... thank you!!!!

Should you feel you would like to assist us with our fundraising please contact The Committee Chairman, Mark Derry.

There are also various other roles that require parent support on the committee. We are very fortunate to have such a dedicated committee, but it is also a small committee and help is always needed to help keep YOUR child's Scout group running smoothly.

Lastly, help is always needed on the uniform side too. And again there are a number of ways you can assist here. You can assist as a Pack or Troop Helper, or go into uniform and become a Scouter. There are also many "smaller" ways where you can make a valuable contribution. Such as judging at competitions, cooking on Cub camps, finding new and interesting venues for Camps, assisting as responsible adults on patrol activities, transporting to various events, transporting equipment (for the bakkie and truck owners), assisting with Cub Craft evenings, assisting in arranging interesting outings, being a badge examiner, or just sharing your interesting past-time or profession with the Cubs or Scouts.

So if you have any interesting hobbies or profession, or any good contacts for outing and camp venues, bright craft ideas or in fact any idea you may think the Cubs or the Scouts would benefit from, please do not hesitate to contact us.

**Remember that EVERY contribution you make, whether on the committee, work parties, fundraising, or activities, it enhances the Scouting experience for the WHOLE Group.**

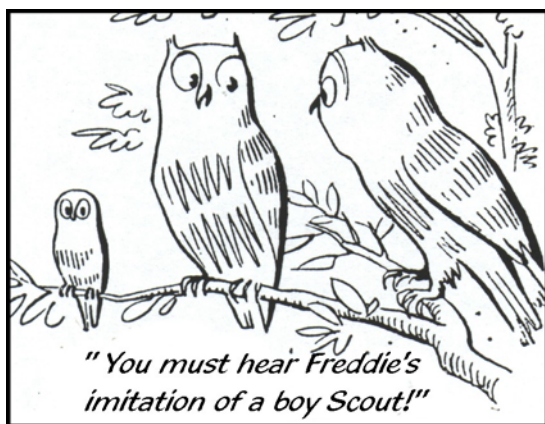
## **COMMUNITY SERVICE**

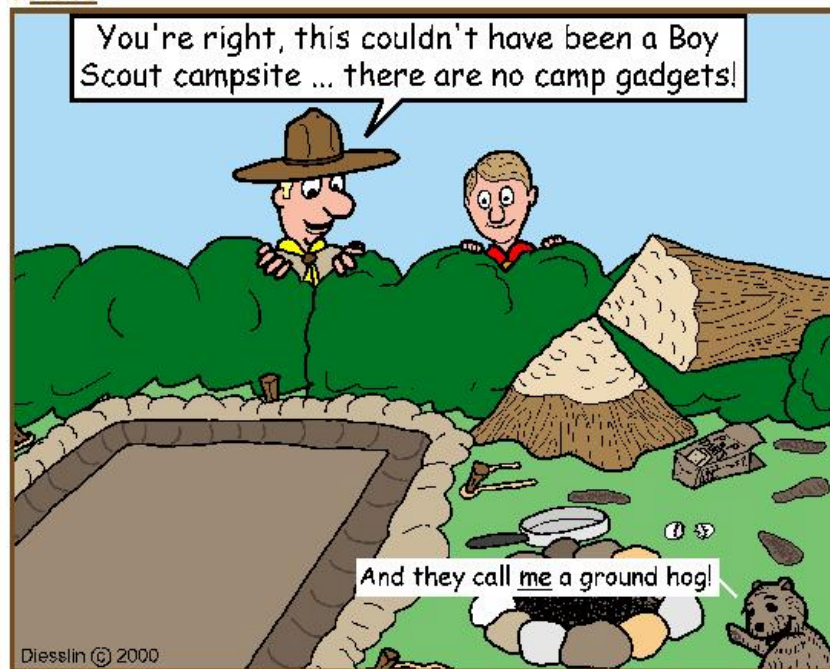

# Tafelberg

It was the morning of the 30<sup>th</sup> of December when my dad and I and some friends got up at 04:30, had a quick breakfast and got ready for the climb up Tafelberg, the second highest peak in the Cedarberg. We left our cottage at 05:00 to get to the bottom of Welbedacht at 05:30 and start hiking. There are four parts to this hike: Welbedacht, Consolation Peak, the scree slope and the chimney. Welbedacht is a long hard slog and at the top is Welbedacht cave, a nice camping spot. We managed to get to the top of Welbedacht before the sun reached us. While we were hiking up Welbedacht there was a fire on Sneeuberg, some three kilometres away, and my dad was worried because if the wind changed that would mean we would have to get off the mountain quickly or lose the car.

Then there was Consolation peak which was not very hard but very exposed to the sun. This slope had the last water that we found on the way up. After that there was the scree slope and by now the sun was beating down on us. The scree slope was just a hard merciless slog which took us up to Spout Cave, another nice camping spot. Here we had an early lunch, rested, and dreamed of the cool swimming spot we had left behind at the cottage.



Then came a huge crack that we had to climb up over huge boulders which took us up to the chimney. My dad said that climbing up the chimney would be difficult because it is a wide gap, but when we got there we were lucky because they had put a chain connected to a rope so it was quite easy. When we got to the top we looked down on the fire. We got quite concerned because the fire had crossed the road in the valley below Sneeuberg, but we saw a Russian MI-8 helicopter or something similar dropping water on the fire. It was a huge fire so the helicopter couldn't put it out, but it did slow it down from burning further. There are two beacons up there so when we got to the first beacon my dad and I spotted the second beacon so only my dad and I went to the second beacon.

Then we started the descent because it was getting late. My dad and I reached the car at precisely 18:00, and the others came a few minutes later, making this hike 12½ hours long.

## **REPORT ON CUBS OUTING TO N.S.R.I.**

On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> November the 1<sup>st</sup> Walmer cubs visited the N.S.R.I. at the harbour. We saw the rubber-duck that they use for rescues. It is a boat the N.S.R.I. use for getting out into the sea quickly. It can fit 4 people and 10 patients. It weighs 1 ton and has a self-righter (a self-righter is for when the boat gets tipped over in the sea and a pump automatically pumps air into a balloon device which causes the boat to right itself). It also has a radio. It can tow other boats and it has a self-drainer so that the boat does not fill up with water (it is a plastic tube coming out of the bottom of the boat with a one-way valve so that water can drain out through it but it can't come back up the pipe). It can travel 16 km without refuelling. The N.S.R.I. have a workshop, a change-room, a control room and a kitchen. They do most of their own repairs on their stuff. They have a tractor to tow boats and help launch the boats. They have 1 rubber-duck and 1 motorboat that cost about 4 million rand; the motorboat can travel 200 nautical miles on 1 tank of fuel. It has turbo-charged motors. It has steel cables along the side of the boat so that if there is a big storm they can clip their harnesses to the steel cable to prevent being washed off the boat. They also have a whole lot of different flares. They have hand-held flares, parachute flares and smoke flares. Smoke flares are used during the day, but not on windy days. A parachute flare gets shot up into the air and then floats down with its parachute.

After we had seen the boats, we went to the clubhouse where we all bought wors rolls and a cooldrink.

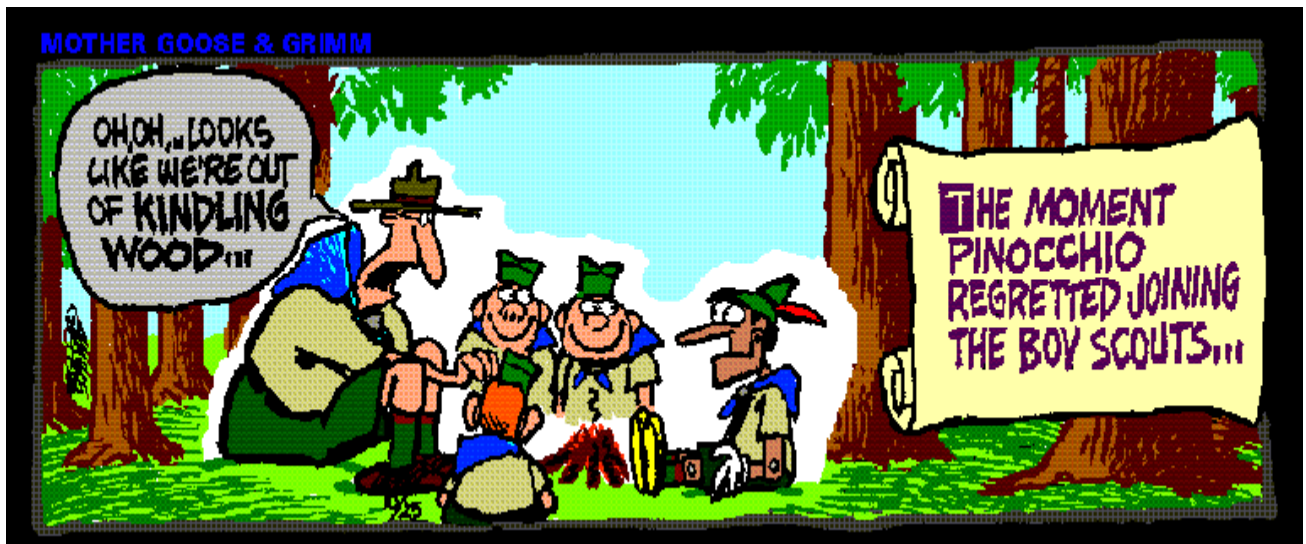
