## FROM THE DESK OF THE CHAPTER EDUCATOR

Okay....we have worked our way from our feet upwards. Now it is time to discuss the most important tool we bring to our motorcycles......our heads! If we take care of our tools, our tools will take care of us. How we think, feel and react to situations all takes place in our heads. Now it is time for a brief anatomy lesson.

The skeleton gives us our human form and protects vital organs. The brain is protected by the skull or cranium. The skull is composed of a number of thick bones that fuse together to form a shell above the eyes and ears. The mandible (or jaw bone) is the only moveable bone on the skull. The cells in the brain are soft and easily injured. Once damaged, they cannot be regenerated or reproduced. Any injury to the head is potentially serious. If not properly treated, what may at first seem minor very quickly can become life threatening.

Since discussing how we can protect our heads by using helmets may become very lengthy, I have divided this subject into sections. This section will focus on motorcyclist facts that were obtained from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). In later articles, I will cover how a helmet works, different types of helmets available and how to make sure you have the right fit.

- Motorcycles make up less than 2% of all registered vehicles and only 0.4% of all vehicle miles traveled, but account for 7% of total fatalities. (NHTSA, 20000)
- In 2000, there were 66 deaths per 100,000 registered motorcycles, compared with 16 deaths per 100,000 registered cars. (Insurance Institute for Highway Safety 2000)
- In 2000, 38% of all motorcyclists involved in fatal crashes were speeding, approximately twice the rate for drivers of cars or light trucks. Alcohol involvement was approximately 50% higher for motorcyclists than for drivers of passenger vehicles. (NHTSA, 2000)
- Helmets reduce the risk of death by 29% and are 67% effective in preventing brain injuries. (NHTSA, 2000)
- In 2000, 45% of motorcycle drivers killed in crashes were not wearing helmets. Of the motorcycle passenger fatalities, 52% were not wearing helmets. (NHTSA, 2000)

I have listed only some of the many statistics that can be found searching the internet. Whether or not you choose to wear a helmet is a personal decision. Please know the laws in your area about helmets and be fully informed about the risks.



#### **Morning – Stone Capades**

These events will consist of:
