THE 40TH ANNUAL INDUSTRY AWARDS PROGRAM

The General Aviation Industry Awards Program is a cooperative effort between the FAA and industry sponsors to recognize outstanding individuals in the Aviation Maintenance Technician, Avionics Technician, and Certificated Flight Instructor fields. The Awards highlight the important role each play in promoting aviation safety and education. Winners will be nationally recognized at the Professional Aviation Maintenance Association (PAMA) convention in 2003 and receive valuable gifts and merchandise provided by the sponsors and contributors.

Criteria/Information

ELIGIBILITY/SELECTION CRITERIA

- Applicants must be an active Aviation Maintenance Technician under FAR Part 65;
 an Avionics Technician actively employed by a FAA-certified Part 145 Repair Station; or an active Certificated Flight Instructor under FAR Part 61, operating within the United States.
- Applicants will be judged on the basis of specific accomplishments and sustained superior performance in their fields.

Application Package should include the following:

- Application Form.
- A résumé of the applicant's professional accomplishments.
- An explanation of the top five contributions the applicant has made to the industry, with at least one during the past year. Include instructional and/or professional techniques.
- An essay (1,000 words or less) explaining why the applicant is deserving of this award.
- · Letters of recommendation pertinent to the type of award.
- · A list of awards and recognitions given to the applicant.
- Supporting documentation (magazines/newspaper articles, etc., maximum of 10).

PROCEDURES

- Applications must be submitted to the applicant's Safety Program Manager at the local FAA Flight Standards District Office by November 1, 2002.
- The winning entry from each District will be forwarded to the FAA Regional Office's Safety Program Manager for selection of a regional award recipient.
- A national award recipient will be selected from the regional winners and notified by <u>February 1, 2003</u>.

AWARD PRESENTATIONS

- District and regional award recipients will be notified of the time and date of their award ceremonies by their Aviation Safety Program Managers.
- The 2002 National Awards are scheduled to be presented in ceremonies at the Professional Aviation Maintenance Association (PAMA) convention in Charlotte, NC, May 13-15, 2003.
- Travel and expenses for the ceremonies will be provided for each winner and one guest.
- · Merchandise and monetary gifts will be presented to each national award recipient.
