Debbie Everhart is the Sunshine Lady.


We have a Couple of the Year for 2007 – Sonny and Betty Dye.



RIDER ED:

To Speed or Not to Speed - It's Your Decision

Exceeding the posted limit or driving too fast for conditions is one of the most prevalent factors contributing to traffic (Motorcycles & Cars) crashes. Speed is a factor in nearly one-third of all fatal crashes. Speed-related crashes cost society more than \$23 billion a year (1994 Dollars). Too few riders/drivers view speeding as an immediate risk to their personal safety or the safety of others. Yet, speeding reduces a rider's/driver's ability to steer safely around curves or objects in the roadway, and it extends the distance required to stop a motorcycle or vehicle in an emergency situations.

Crash severity increases with the speed of the motorcycle or vehicle at impact. Inversely, the effectiveness of restraint' devices like air bags and safety belts, and vehicular construction features such as crumple zones and side member beams decline as impact speed increases. One has none of these on a motorcycle. The exception is the 2007, GL1800 Honda, Gold Wing with the airbag option

The probability of death, disfigurement, or debilitating injury grows with higher speed at impact. Such consequences double for every 10 mph over 50 mph that a motorcycle/vehicle travels. Many riders/drivers don't consider this. They slow their speed in residential areas, or when the weather turns bad. To them, a few miles an hour over the posted speed limit are an acceptable risk. Their excuse -- other drivers do it. They believe the worst that can happen to them is to receive a speeding ticket. Riders/drivers like this are wrong. Maybe even dead wrong, because riding/driving too fast for conditions or exceeding the posted speed limit **can kill you.**

Consider These Speed-Related Facts: Rural roads account for over 60 percent of all speed related fatal crashes. Sixty six percent of speed-related crashes involved a single motorcycle or vehicle. Sixty percent of all speed-related fatal crashes occurred at night (6 pm to 6 am). Riders/drivers involved in speed-related fatal crashes are more likely to have a history of traffic violations. On average, 1,000 Americans are killed every month in speed-related crashes.

Youth and Speeding: Of all drivers aged 15-24 years of age involved in fatal crashes, 32 percent were speeding. Of riders/drivers under age 21 involved in fatal crashes, 38 percent of the male and 24 percent of the female drivers were speeding.

Economic and Environmental Costs of \$peeding: Fuel consumption increases steadily above 45 mph with passenger cars and light trucks using approximately 50 percent more fuel traveling at 75 mph than they do at 55 mph.

Comment: Most motorcycle accidents in this area in North Carolina involve young riders, using excessive speed for the road conditions or the road and their failure to properly maneuver their motorcycle. Generally, it's to much speed (Rocket Power). Imagine a 325 lb Motorcycle carrying a 185 lb rider colliding with a 5,000 lb SUV (Broadside) and knocking over this SUV and killing the driver. Don't think about the young rider, it will only give you bad dreams.

Several members need to renew their CPR/First Aid certification (me included!). I have contacted Tony Ramsey at Davidson County Community College about scheduling a class. For a minimum of 10 people we can take the class for just \$20. At the January 13th planning meeting we can pick a day, perhaps in February.

So, check you cards. If you are about to expire, help is on the way!


