Jesus said to his disciples that lording it over others is unacceptable and that "... whoever wishes to become great must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first must be the slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve and to give his life a ransom for many."

Have mercy and forgive us, for the sake of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Mark 10:35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."
