Col. Dewey's Body Used as 'Warning'

Oct. 4, 1945

SAIGON, Oct. 4—United Revolutionary Front leaders, meeting with French authorities to attempt a settlement of Indo-China unrest, were asked today to return the body of Lieut. Col. A. Peter Dewey of Washington D. C., who was killed Sept. 26.

Lieut. Gen. Douglas Gracey, commander of British forces in Indo-China, said the Annamites were using Dewey's body to demonstrate Urf, or Veit Minh, power in killing an American colonel. Dewey was killed by machine-gun fire as he was passing an Annamite road block en route to his headquarters.

The French-Annamite talks broke down today over a French refusal to continue discussions until hostages are released.

The French cruiser *Triumphante* arrived at Saigon today. First French warship to reach here.
