BRING TOYS FOR CHRISTMAS TO YOUR CONGREGATIONS IN DECEMBER

The Nehemiah Project will be organizing collection points in each of our congregations to accept donations of toys in the month of December to distribute to children in our neighborhoods. A portion of the toys will be donated to children of families attending our food pantries, and the remainder will be presented to the annual Toys for Tots program.

Meanwhile, we are currently carrying out our Fall projects again this year of collecting coats and blankets for distribution to those in need. Pull out your old coats and blankets (ideally reasonably clean) and bring them to your congregations. The Nehemiah Project will collect these items and distribute them to homeless families at St. Anthony's.

Tina Haner of Zion Lutheran continues to head up our newest project - touching the lives of homeless people through the distribution of personal care items. By now, all congregations should have a collection center for such items as tooth paste, tooth brushes, shaving items, etc. Tina has already delivered our first shipment of articles to places where homeless people are best served, such as at St. Anthony's.

THE NEHEMIAH PROJECT TURNS ATTENTION TO YOUTH SERVICE PROJECTS

Youth leaders from our member congregations have been meeting to organize for two youth service events in San Francisco this coming Summer. They will be inviting Lutheran youth from around the Bay Area to visit us in San Francisco over a July weekend and help us with service projects for our churches and the community. Another weekend event in August will focus on serving the needs of homeless populations in the City. This experience will help us plan and prepare for a synod event in 2006. It will take careful planning to find the resources to support these young people and provide supervision and opportunities for Christian learning and fellowship, so again, we need your help. THE FOOD PANTRIES AT GRACE AND SHEPHERD OF HILLS LUTHERAN NOW FOCUS ON MISSIONS

The new Food Pantry at Grace Lutheran Church has now been serving over 100 families every Saturday morning, and the original food pantry at Shepherd of the Hills distributed food to 66 families in the second week of November and looks as if it will continue to grow. While we cannot ask client families to attend worship services as a condition for food distribution, and we cannot use overt evangelism programs, we can talk with our clients and let them know how Christ is the center and support of our own lives. Most of the families served at Grace are Cantonese-speaking. While we have had a good core of volunteers for both Saturday distributions, **we need Cantonese-speaking volunteers** at the Grace Food Pantry to assist these client families with food selections and to answer their questions about how we can help their families in many other ways.

DO YOU LIKE TO SHOP? WE HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOU!

We particularly need volunteers for our Friday Delivery Acceptance teams at both Grace and SOTH. These teams wait for the Food Bank delivery truck between 1:00 and 3:00 p.m. on Friday afternoon, unload the pallets of food when they arrive, and stock the food and produce to the tables in the distribution room so it is all ready for our distribution on Saturday. **Our weekly shoppers also need help to move the carts around with food once a week at the S.F. Food Bank – so if you like shopping and have a couple of hours on Wednesday or Thursday morning, please let us know.**

And the shopping does cost the Nehemiah Project money each week. The San Francisco Food Bank gives us plenty of free fresh produce every week, but they sell us the food at \$.18 per pound of dry food (cans, cereal boxes, whatever) and \$.04 per pound for bread. Thus the Nehemiah Project spends about \$80 to \$90 of food per week for each pantry. So if you want to make a special offering to the Nehemiah project to help us buy food, we would appreciate that very much.

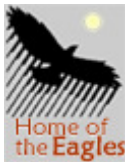

Forum for Lutheran High School in San Francisco

On Monday, November 15th, over 40 people attended an initial meeting toward starting a Lutheran High School in San Francisco and the immediate area. It was a most encouraging "forum," with an excellent presentation by Mr. Kris Schneider, Principal of Sacramento Lutheran High School. Out of this meeting, an exploratory task force is being formed. Survey sheets were passed out inviting those who attended to participate in such ways as prayer, exploratory committee, help developing a business plan, financial gifts, etc. If you would like one of these sheets, contact the office at West Portal Lutheran Church (661-0242); the sheets are being collated and received by Mrs. Barbara Louie of Holy Spirit Lutheran Church.

The forum did not dwell on what took place in the past in an effort to establish a San Francisco Lutheran High School. Instead, a strong missional emphasis on leading souls to Jesus Christ was made, as well as the quality of such a school academically and in other ways. Mr. Schneider, the son-in-law of founding president of Concordia University-Irvine (Christ College), Dr. Charles Manske, is himself a product of Lutheran schools and colleges. He gave sound guidance at the forum, recommending that we engage Synod's Genesis Project to help us in the initial stages of development. Please keep this vision of a Lutheran High School in San Francisco in your prayers to the Lord that His perfect will may be done and that He may give us the courage of our faith and convictions to act.

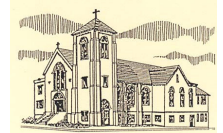

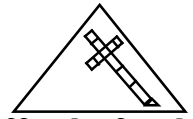

This follow-up to the Gospel Night of June 26th was a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with members of the community. The next event will be the annual Chinese New Year Celebration.

Hope Lutheran Church will hold Advent Worship Services on December 1st, 8th and 15th at 7pm; Christmas Eve Worship Service at 11pm; Christmas Day Worship Service at 10am and New Year’s Eve Worship Service at 7pm.

As the cool winds of winter descend upon the Sunset in San Francisco, our thoughts turn to Thanksgiving and Advent season. A joyful season filled with thanksgiving and anticipation!

Our congregation has just completed "A Pastoral Quality" survey, as we begin our search for a new pastor. November 7th we held a Forum, of all fellowship leaders, which met with our advisor, Rev Ted Iverson. This Forum will provide quality feedback for Rev. Iverson in his role as our congregation's advisor during the pastoral vacancy. We expect to begin the Call process for a pastor early next year.

November 14th our congregation will have a Thanksgiving Foodfest after our morning worship services. A large variety of food will be offered, followed by a Silent Auction and Talent Show. The proceeds will benefit The SF Lutheran Nehemiah Project and Holy Spirit's Building Expansion Fund. Two food barrels from the SF Food Bank have been delivered to our church for the collection of donated non-perishable foods and canned foods.

November 20th at 4 p.m. there will be a gathering of persons to be baptized and confirmed on December 12th. Many of these persons are from China, where they never heard of Jesus. They will give their testimonies of how they come to know the Lord, and how the Love of Jesus has changed their lives.

December 12th there will be 6 baptisms and 20 persons confirmed. What a day of rejoicing this will be as we witness these persons begin their new life in Jesus Christ.

December 12th at 4 p.m., followed by dinner, there will be a Christmas celebration for Cantonese Speaking Seekers at Hope Lutheran Church. Friends and relatives are invited to this special Cantonese Gospel Outreach.

December 17th at 7 p.m. the English Ministry proudly presents a Christmas Musical Celebration & Banquet, featuring Pastor Lenny Szeto as the speaker and a musical production directed by our own Christopher Ng.

2005 Youth Mission Trip to Tijuana, Mexico! We have 28 youths registered for the trip to Tijuana June 11 - June 19, 2005. They will have the opportunity to experience a Christ-centered & community impacting mission trip. We pray these young people will have a "servant" and "missionary" heart as they focus on two primary areas: children and home improvement. The work with children consists of a hands-on afternoon program known as Kids Club. The group will be staying and sleeping at an orphanage. There will be two days of home building projects under direction of Youthworks (the organization that is hosting this event). They will be bringing hope to a family and the opportunity to share the love of Christ with them.

Looking to the Road Ahead at New Life

On September 26, 2004, New Life celebrated Education Sunday by honoring all our Small Group, Fellowship, and Sunday School leaders. It was a very special day as we gave thanks and praise to God for their collective service to our Lord through the vital ministry of leading and teaching at New Life. While we spent some time reflecting on the past, we also asked our leaders to help seek clarity in God's will for New Life in 2005 and beyond. With the help of a survey provided by Natural Church Development, 30 leaders/members were asked to candidly provide answers about their spiritual journey at New Life. This marks only the beginning, as there will be follow on meetings to review the survey results, interpret the results, and put some concrete plans in place after prayerfully considering what God reveals to us through this process.

In December, at our follow up meeting and planning day, New Life's leaders will once again gather; this time to determine even more precisely God's future desire for New Life. The Rev. Ed Krueger, Mission Executive, CNH District LCMS, who has experience in leading churches to realize their specific mission in doing the work of sharing the Gospel, will help provide support and guidance as New Life fine tunes her God given mission.

Sermon Series: The Lutheran Difference

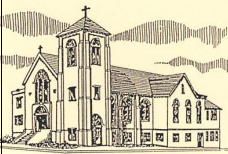

- Outreach Task Force - Terry Wong, Chair
- Education Task Force - Richard Ulmer, Chair (This Task Force will address issues other than the Day School ministry.)

Some members of the Outreach Task Force and Pastor Zimmerman recently attended the National Outreach Conference in San Diego, CA, November 3 through 6, in order to get some ideas that can be used to improve our outreach to the people of our community. Likewise, Pastor Zimmerman and Agnes Lee attended a Small Group workshop at the CA-NV-HI District office in order to become facilitators and trainers for a small group ministry start at Zion.

The fifth Task Force is the Building Expansion Committee that is already well along the way in its work. It is currently working with the architect and engineers developing the detailed plans needed to submit to the City Building Department. Serious construction should be underway this spring, although some preliminary steps may begin before Christmas.
