REPORT OF THE STUDENT CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE TO THE JOINT COLLEGE MEETING JANUARY 21, 2003

In March 1996, Trinity students voted by referendum in favour of a \$85 capital campaign levy for the next seven years, in support of the College's Spirit of Leadership Capital Campaign. The current year is the last year of the levy.

The levy has raised over \$800,000 and has made it possible to complete a number of projects that benefit students, including:

- JCM Bursaries (\$200,000). Double-matched under the OSOTF program, the JCM Bursary Fund now provides \$30,000 annually for students in financial need.
- Renovations to the JCR, the Adams Room, the Stedman Library (\$48,500).
- A new lighting system for the GIT (\$40,000).
- The Ralph McMaster Room in the Graham Library (\$200,000).
- The new Buttery (\$254,000).

In most cases, student funds were matched by the College as an indication of the College's support for these initiatives.

Decisions on these projects were made over the years by the JCM based on recommendations by the SCCC, after reviewing proposals and consulting with the College administration.

The \$85 levy was derived as follows:

- \$50 new levy
- \$25 reduction in the College fee
- \$10 reallocation of previous student society fees.

The SCCC believes the capital levy is highly desirable and should be extended, allowing students to continue influencing the direction of capital and other improvements at the College.

An extension of the levy requires a new referendum, and possibly a review of the amount of the levy and the description of its purpose. The referendum can be held at the same time as the Heads elections in March.

<u>Recommendation</u>: THAT the JCM instruct the SCCC to review the amount and purpose of the capital levy and to develop an appropriate referendum question for consideration at the next JCM.
