Liszt and the Cross: Music as Sacrament in the B Minor Sonata

This lecture recital examines the intimate relationship between religion and art in the life and music of Franz Liszt. The opening of the lecture examines the historically tragic consequences of the Great Schism of 1054 and its relationship to the current status of the arts in the West. The Orthodox iconographic tradition is also explored as it represents a critical divergence from the West in understanding the relationship between art and religion. The second half of the lecture explores in detail Liszt's use of religious symbolism, presented as a type of "aural" icon in his greatest work for piano, the Sonata in B Minor.

Samuel Barber and the Dance of History: The Complete Piano Music

This lecture/recital presents the theme of the "dance of history," a process where the composer and performer reveal the spiritual and intellectual richness of the musical past by leaping temporal boundaries and recreating that past for audiences here in the present. As a creative example of this historical dance, the solo piano repertoire of Samuel Barber is explored. 
