## About the Band

The Heatherbell Girls Pipes and Drums were formed in 1964 by the late P/M Harold Sutherland. The Heatherbell Girls have a distinguished list of accomplishments in the 37 year history of this remarkable organization. Each year they travel extensively throughout the Maritime Provinces of Canada and the Northern USA, participating in parades and festivals as Official Good Will Ambassadors of the County and Town of Pictou, and the Province of Nova Scotia. Over the years they have entertained Her Majesty the Queen on two occasions, and Her Royal Highness Princess Anne during her last visit to Nova Scotia. They have represented Nova Scotia as youth ambassadors for the Canada 125 celebrations in Ottawa and were Nova Scotia's Official Ambassadors to the Cabot 500 Celebrations in Newfoundland in 1997.

In 1999 the Heatherbells travelled to Calgary to participate in the Calgary Stampede, they were award winners in the Stampede parade and also received a Silver Medal in the World Showband Competition held at the Saddledome in Calgary as part of the Stampede celebrations. The Heatherbells are members of the Atlantic Provinces Pipe Band Association and are current Champion Supreme in Grade 5 for Atlantic Canada.

This album is dedicated to those hundreds of young ladies who have been a part of Heatherbell Tradition of Pride and Excellence. Today, the spirit and pride, passed down over the years, lives on in a new generation of Heatherbells.
