The first obstacle was to explain to people accustomed to dealing with a structured organization how the WLA has no structure and no direct affiliation to the Libertarian Party. Time will tell how Tucson Libertarian Party members adapt to the fluidity of the WLA.

The next WLA meeting in Tucson will be held on Wednesday October 16 at 6:00 at Cody's, and will continue to meet monthly at the same location and time on the third Wednesday of the month.
