To help us get to know each other a little better, this new feature article will introduce a different Illinois Red Hawk Rider member each month.

#### This month's featured WOW member is Marge Thiessen, Ride Coordinator.

I have lived in Woodstock for the past 10 years and retired 2 years ago as a Flower Shop Manager. Now I help out in various departments during busy times only which is great!! I started riding passenger once I met David about 14 years ago. I was curious how he "drove" the machine so I took the Motorcycle Safety Class in 1989 and much to my surprise I passed?? Then I needed a bike. In the Spring of 1990, I purchased by first Harley, an 883 sportster. I had much to learn about riding but we took some great rides and I certainly enjoyed it. As the years passed, the rides got longer and the Sportster just wasn't that comfortable, so in 1996 I purchased my current Harley Low Rider.

We have enjoyed some great trips (one long one each year) with the I llinois Prairie Voyagers. These trips included the Blue Ridge Parkway, the Black Hills, West Virginia, the upper peninsula of Michigan, etc. We have also taken some recent year trips with the Gold Wing Group to Michigan and Springfield, Missouri. I enjoy these long trips the best. Our toy poodle, Mandy, travels with us most of the time and is a great traveler and camper! She rides in her crate, which is bungied on to the back seat of David's Gold Wing.

Riding allows you to feel very much part of the landscape around you. You smell the smells of sweet flowers, such as clover and lilacs along the way. I love the canopies of trees over small country roads, and the scents of the forests with pine needles. When riding along a winding mountain stream, I want to stop and soak my feet while watching the water spill over the rocks. Besides the ride, setting up camp, then cooking dinner with other riders and then sitting around a camp fire is a really good feeling.

A few weeks ago we rode with the Illinois Prairie Voyagers to Springfield, Illinois to camp and see the sights. One day we rode south to Litchfield and along the route were short areas of Route 66 from the 1926 to 1930 era. Some sections were brick with the grass growing up between them. Other sections were concrete, very old and narrow with sharp turns. I have wanted to ride Route 66 the full length. Much of the road is no longer in existence but it still would be fun to pick and choose areas to ride and sights of the past to visit.

I think we learn all the time how to be a better rider. Talking with other riders and discussions at rallies, reading the magazines and watching videos as we recently did, all help us think about dangers and plan for escapes. I have found having the CB is really great. When in a group, the leader can warn of dangers or great sights. We need to ride staggered, keep a safe distance and never outride our skills. During group rides we need to be aware of various riders limitations and adjust our ride so that all can be comfortable and enjoy the ride safely.
