First Ride: ZX-9R by Jim Holzberger

What to do on a Saturday while the Huskies are losing? Take a test ride on the 1998 Kawasaki ZX-9R!

I was fortunate to wrangle a ride on one of the

first of these amazing machines to hit our shores. Unfortunately, the weather was somewhat uncooperative (45deg. and intermittent drizzle) and did not allow me to explore the 9R's cornering capabilities. What I can say about the bike is that it's comfortable, light, and wicked fast. Like a 900RR only more so. Hop on the 600 size machine and fire it up. It only takes a minute for two bars to show on the digital temp. gauge and you're ready to go.

Tall first gear- not to worry, the 9R will pull cleanly from low RPM. Get out on the road in traffic and appreciate the light nimble feel. Nice bike, I think to myself, feels like a firmly suspended F3. A few miles south and the traffic clears enough to exercise the highly oversquare motor. Roll into the throttle at an indicated 35mph in 2nd and hold on! The 9R rockets forward

as the front wheel reaches for the sky, grab 3rd and 4th and you're literally flying. Time to check out the binders, 6 piston Tokico's with great feel and bite. I've never ridden anything that accelerates as fiercely as the 9R.

Clyde Akers at Puyallup Kawasaki had already put on some ultrasticky D207GPs by the time I got to ride the bike. Good thing, as wheelspin was easy to induce on the cold semi-damp pavement. The 9R really rips. Of course, for someone as tall as me the top half of the tach is obscured by the back edge of the windscreen. Fancy new electronic carbs and 3D ignition mapping courtesy of a throttle position sensor make for a near seamless rush of power. The faster the engine turns, the harder it pulls. Throttle response is quicker than with most CV type carbs, no noticeable lag. I'm glad that it was bilious Kawasaki Racing Green or I might have had to rethink my Yamaha order.

Kawasaki should do something about the harsh compression damping in the front, the front wheel has a difficult time tracking the pavement under hard acceleration - even at just slightly over the speed limit. Perhaps this can be dialed out, but I think a call to RaceTech or Lindemann would be in order. If my new Yamaha is this good I'll be overjoyed.

I'm afraid, very afraid - for my license that is. Clyde was good enough to let me sample his new bike, he has 4 more coming. '98 looks to be the year of the Sportbike.
