### Destination Highways - Book Review

Let me state that YES, I can read!

Wow - this book is the bible of motorcycling in Washington. There is an equivalent version for BC that is just as good.

Destination Highways, or DH, are roads that are entertaining in themselves, often times leading to great cities or towns throughout the state. Roads are evaluated on the TIRES system (Total Integrated Road Evaluation System) which looks at Twistiness, Pavement, Engineering (lane/shoulder width, sightlines, and camber), Remoteness, Scenery, and Character (blend of overall quality). Mileage is listed and traffic is rated, but is not included in the TIRES total.

Interestingly enough, 7 of the top 10 are roads we do regularly on club rides, and the top 4 are ones that you should be able to guess without even looking in the book.

- #1 North Cascades Highway (SR-20) from Rockport to Winthrop,
- #2 Windy Ridge (FR-99),
- #3 Spirit Lake Highway (SR-504) from Castle Rock to Mount St Helens, and

#4 - FR 25 - Randle to Cougar.

This book is well written, contains great maps and descriptions, is informative (includes gas, hotel/motel/camping/B&B, taverns (for the HD guys), coffee shops (for the posers), and bike shops), and is hilarious. Did you know that BAMBI is the spiritual leader of a woodland terrorist organization?

The book is divided into various regions of the state, including the DONUT HOLE which is an area that doesn't offer squat for pleasurable riding on a bike. This includes the area north-south between Kennewick and Grand Coulee and east-west between Wenatchee to Ritzville. Yes, Hanford is contained within this "hole".

There are 346 roads total, with 74 as DHs and 272 as TEs (Twisted Edge) roads, which are side trips from the main DH. I originally thought that of the 74 DHs listed, that I would've probably ridden at least 70 of them. I was wrong. Though I have been on most, or ridden past all of them, there were detours (TEs) listed that I had no idea were worthy of riding. It looks like I may have an excuse now to rack up more monster miles on the new bike (more on this later) next year.

If it sounds like I am actually excited to ride in Washington - shh, don't tell anyone. Yes, Northern California rocks, and Oregon is only slightly less appealing. However, I do have a renewed inspiration to go explore the Evergreen state.
