37th Lowe Family Reunion, Crystal City, VA by C. London

The 37th Lowe Family Reunion was hosted by the Lowe Family members of the Washington Metropoltian area in Crystal City, VA, Friday, July 28 through Sunday, July 30, 2000. Accommodations were at the Crystal City Marriot Hotel.

The reunion registration began Friday afternoon followed by the family cookout which was held at Fort Ward Park, Alexandria, VA. After returning from the park the Annual Family Meeting was held at the hotel. Later in the evening the hospitality suite was open for family fellowship and other activities. There was also time for shopping, movies and some enjoyed the night life.

On Saturday, July 29 the family was up early for a full day of activities. Many family members enjoyed a bus tour of Washington, DC, which featured a tour of Cedar Hill, the home of Frederick Douglass, located in the Anacostria area of the city. The site which is preserved by the National Park Service includes a Visiter Center where we were shown a short film about the life and achievements of Mr. Douglass. The tour continued at the home of Frederick Douglass where we learn more about him, his family, and the people he worked with in his time. We also learned about the way of life in his time. One thing we learned was there were no closets in the home because taxes were levied based on the number of rooms in houses, and closets were considered rooms, so wardrobes and dresser were used for the storage of clothing and other things. Also, while touring the house it was pointed out that beds of that time were shorter and people slept in an almost upright position because it was thought that ones breathing would be effected if you slept flat on your back. The bus tour continued through historic neighborhoods in Southeast Washington, downtown Washington, D.C., Capitol Hill, Georgetown, and the Shaw Neighborhood. We also saw Union Station

were we broke briefly for lunch and to stretch our legs.

Some family members elected to spend the day shopping at Potomac Yards Shopping Center about a mile from hotel. The shopping center includes big stores such as Old Navy, Barnes and Nobles Books, Target, and also houses a large movie theater complex.

The schedule of events continued later Saturday with the family banquet at the hotel. The featured entertainment of the event was a play performed by members of the family about Lonnie and Lula Lowe, and their life together. The play, "The Family of the Past the Family of the Future", was written by Pamela A. Lowe, and narrated by Viola Washington. Portraying, Lonnie and Lula, were Earl Lowe and Terrina Williams. Their children were played by Samantha Jones, Brittany London, Akeem and Warren Stevenson, Shaneice and Kyara Lombre.

The reunion concluded with Sunday worship service which was held at Galilee A.M.E. Church, in Washington, DC followed with dinner at Ella's Country Kitchen in Capitol Heights, MD.

The Life of Frederick Douglass

Fred erick Douglass was born into slavery on the Eastern Shore of Maryland in 1818, and was given the name Frederick Augustus Washington Bailey (Baly), after his mother Harriet Bailey. During the course of his remarkable life he escaped from slavery, became internationally renowned for his eloquence in the cause of liberty, and went on to serve the national government in several official capacities. Through his work he came into contact with many of the leaders of his times. His early work in the cause of freedom brought him into contact with a wide array of abolitionists and social reformers, including William Lloyd Garrison, Elizabeth Cady Stanton, John Brown, Gerrit Smith and many others. As a major Stationmaster on the Underground Railroad he directly helped hundreds on their way to freedom through his adopted home city of Rochester, NY.

Renowned for his eloquence, he lectured throughout the US and England on the brutality and immorality of slavery. As a publisher his North Star and Frederick Douglass' Paper brought news of the anti-slavery movement to thousands. Forced to leave the country to avoid arrest after John Brown's raid on Harper's Ferry, he returned to become a staunch advocate of the Union cause. He helped recruit African American troops for the Union Army, and his personal relationship with Lincoln helped persuade the President to make Emancipation a cause of the Civil War. Two of Douglass' sons served in the 54th Massachusetts Regiment, which was made up entirely of African American volunteers. The storming of Fort Wagner by this regiment was dramatically portrayed in the film Glory! A painting of this event hangs in the front hall at Cedar Hill.

All of Douglass' children were born of his first marriage, to Anna Murray. He met Murray, a free African American, in Baltimore while he was still held in slavery. They were married soon after his escape to freedom. After the death of his first wife, Douglass married his former secretary, Helen Pitts, of Rochester, NY. Douglass dismissed the controversy over his marriage to a white woman, saying that in his first marriage he had honored his mother's race, and in his second marriage, his father's.

In 1872, Douglass moved to Washington, DC where he initially served as publisher of the New National Era, intended to carry forward the work of elevating the position of African Americans in the post-Emancipation period. This enterprise was discontinued when the promised financial backing failed to materialize. In this period Douglass also served briefly as President of the Freedmen's National Bank, and subsequently in various national service positions, including US Marshal for the District of Columbia, and diplomatic positions in Haiti and the Dominican Republic.(Source: http://www/nps.gov/frdo/fdlife.html)
