The fellowships will help underclassmen attend summer journalism institutes at colleges or universities. Then they will return to their high school and be mentors to their classmates. The CJF was established in honor of Dr. Alyce S. Culpepper, the first journalism teacher at South Plantation High School, who began the award-winning newspaper, yearbook, literary magazine and television programs at the school.

A photograph must be attached for publication purposes only. **A teacher recommendation is required.** The completed application must be postmarked by April 1, 2008 and mailed to the CJF, 100 S.W. 75th Terrace, Plantation, Florida 33317. (If you plan to go to the Summer Journalism Institute at the University of Florida in Gainesville, you need to apply now. Only 80 students will be admitted to SJI. Information is at www.jou.ufl.edu. If you receive a CJF fellowship the deposit will be reimbursed.)
