- 14. describe the rise of the new feminist movement, and the gains and setbacks for women and minorities in the 1970s
- 15. Explain the connection between Middle East conflicts and the troubled American economy and describe the attempts of American administrations of the 1970s to solve both sets of problems
- 16. Discuss the Iranian crisis and its political consequences for Carter
