UNIT OUTCOMES: To develop a comprehensive understanding of the following four themes in Indian History.

- 1. Next to the Tigris-Euphrates-Nile valley countries, India has the longest history of any civilization, in the world.
- 2. A constantly recurring and decisive element in India's 5000 years of history has been the intrusion of new forces from outside, their clash with those already there, and the slow process of resolving the disharmonies thus created.
- 3. The Indian Subcontinent has been the "breeding ground" of religions.
- 4. During the 5000 years of civilization in India prior to the arrival of the British, there were three great periods in which outstanding leadership resulted in a flourish of achievement. Each of these high-points had a religious basis.
