- A. People's Republic of China (P.R.C., Communist China, Red China, Mainland China)
- B. Republic of China (Taiwan, Nationalist China, Formosa)

II. Size and Shape

- A. third largest country in the world

Russia. - 6.5 mil. sq. miles
Canada - 3.83
China - 3.70
U.S.A. - 3.68
(Brazil - 3.29)

- B. along with size, the dimensions of China are similar to those of the United States

3,000 miles east-to-west
2,500 miles north-to-south

III. Population

- A. China has the largest population in the world – 6,060, 884, 000 (4/2000) China = 21.1%

P.R.C. - 1,246,871,000 (1999 est.)
India - 1,000,848,000 (1999 est.)
U.S.A. - 272,639,000 (1999 est.)
Indonesia - 216,108,000 (1999 est.)
(followed by Brazil and Russia)

- B. Ethnic groups

1. 92% Han Chinese
2. minorities include Tibetans, Mongols, Koreans, Manchus, etc.

- C. Language - the official language is Mandarin Chinese

XII. Analysis

- A. China is isolated (N-Great Wall, E-water, S-rainforest, SW-mountains, NW-desert)
 - 1. isolated from Western civilization
 - 2. aided in the formation of a uniform culture (inhibits cultural diffusion)
- B. contrasts ("China" video)
 - 1. urban (27%) - rural (73%) "a country of peasants"
 - 2. tillable - nontillable (2/3rds mountainous or desert)
 - 3. North China proper - South China proper
