I. Continental issues

- A. Africa is a continent consisting of 53 countries (184 in the world)
- B. Africa is often confused with South America (shape, names, "horn", Congo-Amazon, location)
- C. Africa (the continent) is three times larger than the U.S. (the country) and is the 2nd largest continent (20% of the world's landmass)
- D. Africa is primarily in the tropics and depends on seasonal rains
- E. 2/3rds of the world's poorest countries are in Africa (1.2% of world GNP – same as Belgium with 10 million people)

X. Resources - Africa is rich in minerals
