Ms. Shallow once made reference to Dawn's auditing of the class but never asked her to leave. Brian Doody, the drama teacher, always showed interest and concern for his students. He was always there to support the students in their endeavors. Dawn had recently corresponded with Mr. Doody via email and he has not forgotten his years at Cabrini and he enjoys catching up with his Cabrini students.

As Dawn's religion is Anglican she did not have to participate in Father William Ryan's religion classes; however, she sat in on some of his classes just for the enjoyment listening and speaking with him.
