- 5. The electoral district for purposes of voting is limited by the boundaries of each precinct. Only voters who are registered to vote in each precinct can vote for their respective precinct committeeman.
- 6. The electoral district for precinct committeeman is the precinct, not the entire county of Du Page.
- 7. The State Board of Elections considers the Libertarian Party to be an established party in any Representative District which includes any portion of the former 39<sup>th</sup> Representative District. State of Illinois Candidate's Guide 2002, page 16. (Issued by the State Board of Elections).
- 8. No timely Objection was filed challenging the nominating papers of any of the Libertarian Party Precinct Committeeman candidates by the deadline for filing such objections.
- 9. Each candidate filed the requisite forms with their nominating petitions and each of those filings is valid on its face.

This Offer of Proof is submitted for purposes of judicial review and the candidates herein continue to assert there is no jurisdiction and no authority vested in the Du Page County Electoral Board to consider anything further than a facial examination of the nominating papers of these candidates, which results in the only conclusion this Board can reach - that the papers of each candidate are in order and that their names should be printed on the ballot for the Primary Election.
