Purpose of a Booktalk Share a book that you have enjoyed. Convince the listeners to read the book. "Booktalks give a glimpse of the book, ensnaring the listener's attentionA good booktalk reaches out to the listenersand makes them care enough about the peop in the book to want to read it and see what happens at the end of the talk." Booktalk! By Joni Bodart
Preparation
 Write an interesting opening—you want to grab the audience's attention Prepare a talk that includes the following (write it out so you can practice): ★Title of the book, author, genre, brief summary of the plot ★You will need to tell enough about the story to involve and entice the audience—BUT NEVER TELL THE ENDING Find a scene from the book that you will read aloud—it may be funny or suspenseful—remember the purpose is to intrigue the audience and make them wan to read the book to find out what happens in the story End your talk with a concluding sentence that will also persuade the listeners to read the book—a commentary, a recommendation, a personal connection, etc.
Presentation
Practice! Practice! Practice! ★Plan what you are going to do, how you will display the book, what you will
do with your hands
★ Rehearse the section that you will be reading from the book so you can read it with expression and pronounce all the words correctly
Have a copy of the book to display that is marked with the page(s) that you will read aloud
Speak loudly and clearly—so the audience can hear and appreciate your message
