The Foundation has \$62,543.00 invested. This year it received \$3,573.00 and spent \$2,835.00. It has \$2,764.00 to give away.

<u>The Lloyd W. Stuart Ministerial Educational Fund</u> gave one pastor \$100.00 toward ordination costs. It has \$17,146.00 invested.

<u>The Small Church Assistance Fund – Standard Memorial</u> gave \$1,000.00 to the Colton church. It has \$10,530.00 invested.

<u>The Ministerial Education Fund – Dayton Memorial</u> has \$32,936.00 invested. It gave \$1500.00 to three Districts (\$500.00 each) toward a post graduate degree.

The Foundations mission it to (1) Give grants to churches that have a valid need. (2) Give grants toward ordination costs to pastors seeking ordination and (3) Give grants to ministerial members furthering their education above the undergraduate level.

Grants are only for Eastern New York/New England District churches and pastors. Requests for a **Dayton Memorial Grant** must be received by June 1, 2008 for the fall of 08 and the spring of 09.

#### 2006-2007 WESLEYAN BIBLE CAMP REPORT

General Superintendent, Dr. Earle Wilson; District Superintendent, Dr. Edward Lindsey; delegates and friends of the 165<sup>th</sup> Annual District Conference of the Eastern New York/New England District of the Wesleyan Church. Greeting to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This past year has been a very difficult year in the life of our camp. We started this year with a positive family camp. We had excellent speakers and quality music. There was a great spirit on the grounds. It was a wonderful time of retreat and refreshing.

As you are very well aware this has been a devastating year financially for the camp. Pledges and support have failed to meet the financial needs. We have sent out appeals across the district and received very little in commitments. Due to the growing demands of the Clinton County Health Department, the increase of expenses and the limited funds received we have found ourselves with a large deficit. We are also faced with buildings and facilities that are in need of extensive work and repair. These are matters of great concern.

The camp committee and the district board of administration have spent much time and effort in addressing the issues facing the camp. There have been some difficult decisions that have had to be made. None of these decisions were made without thoughtful and prayerful consideration. We have had to cancel all of our district functions on the Wesleyan Bible Campgrounds this year. The CCHD did give us a waiver on the mandated water system upgrade so we could offer cottage owners the use of their cottages during the summer. This is a one time waiver and will require the work is completed in the coming year.

The reality of the need we have is money. We cannot operate camp the way we have in the past. With the level of pledge support we have had over the past several years we will not meet the continuing needs of the camp. I have received offers of work teams to come and do many of the needed projects on the grounds. However, until we solve out deficit problem and raise the funds needed above that for materials there is no money to do the work. We have the need of an initial investment reaching well into the hundreds of thousands of dollars. Above that there is a yearly budget support level needed that is significantly larger then we have had in the past. The challenges we are faced with are large and many. The need is simple. The need is money.

Let's pray together as we face the days ahead in the life of the Wesleyan Bible Camp.
