News digest

The month in review

April 2000 was a month of expectant consolidation for the ASP industry. Established ASPs began to roll out marketing campaigns or partnerships, while both old and new platform vendors put final touches to new ASP infrastructure offerings. Meanwhile, the ASP Industry Consortium prepared to celebrate its first birthday in May.

As a supplement to this issue of the newsletter, ASPnews.com has published a draft excerpt from a new report scheduled for publication late next month. Called *Dawn of the application engine*, it was emailed separately last week to existing subscribers. It seeks to make new sense of the ASP landscape, and many of the findings in that document are echoed in the features in this issue.

We lead with Toolwire (page 9), a startup ASP that seems to exemplify the use of the model to go beyond merely delivering applications, taking advantage of the Internet computing environment to enable new business practices through cross-company collaboration and process automation.

Peoples of t's new in-house ASP unit (page 10) provides a more traditional application, but still illustrates the increasing segmentation of the ASP stack into different pockets of expertise,
