## **PLANT TABLE RESULTS:**

There were many species on the plant table this month and the S.A. Species were particularly well represented.

# Plants on Display included:

- ❖ Stanhopea jenishiana occurs from Colombia to Southern Peru and its unusual waxy blooms smell of cinnamon.
- Arachnis flos-aeris fast growing species from Malaysia, which thrives in a sunny spot in the garden.
- Cyrtorchis arcuata very common Epiphyte throughout S.A. Flowers are sweetly scented at night.
- Cyrtorchis praetermissa var. zuluensis common Epiphyte in humid coastal forests of KZN.
- <u>Diaphananthe millarii</u> rare Epiphyte known only from a few localities near E.L. and Durban.

- ❖ Aerangis mystacidii grows in deep shade along streams and occurs in Eastern Cape to KZN. Also in Swaziland, Zimbabwe, Malawi, Zambia & Tanzania.
- Stenoglottis fimbriata often found growing on rocks and moss covered tree trunks. Occurs from Eastern Cape to KZN, Swaziland, Zimbabwe, Malawi and Tanzania.

#### Hybrids on display included:

Ascocenda Harvest Moon, Colmanara Wildcat "Bobcat" (oncidium x miltonia x odontoglossum), Cookara Tropical Snowflake (Caularthron x Laelia x Broughtonia x Cattleya) and Vanda coerulea x tricolor.
