Last Meeting:

Important points to remember on Water Quality:

- Monitor the PH of your water as the availability of nutrients to a plant varies at different PH levels.
- \triangleright A PH of 5.6 6.5 is ideal.
- ➤ It is also important to measure the EC of your fertilizer solution as a solution with a high concentration of dissolved salts will result in reverse osmosis taking place.
- \triangleright Aim for an EC reading of 0.8 1.2 ms/cm
- Tips for managing poor water quality:
 - Apply very weak solutions of fertilizer more often.
 - Flush your pots well & regularly to leach out excess accumulated salts.

Culture Tip for the Month:

<u>Some more points on Watering</u>: The best way to decide whether to water your orchids or not is to check the potting medium. This is done by:

- (a) Sticking your finger or a sharp end of a pencil into the medium. If the medium feels wet or the pencil is moist, delay watering for a few days and then check again. Water when the medium feels slightly moist and not entirely dry.
- (b) Water by Weight. Lift your orchid an hour or so after you next water. Make a mental note of how much it weighs. Lift it again in a few days and when it feels significantly lighter, water.
- (c) Pull out the plant's label and feel whether it is wet or dry.
- (d) Have a Tester Pot. The same size, full of the same mix but without a plant in it, on every bench. When in doubt, tip the mix out to see whether you should water or not. Bearing in mind that pots containing plants will dry out sooner because the plants are using water. Return the mix to the tester pot quickly, before it has time to dry out and place back onto the bench, ready for next time.
 - Whenever you water be sure to:
 - a) Use tepid water as cold water can shock your orchid.
 - b) Wet all sections of the plant's container.
 - ❖ Avoid watering plants during very cold spells.
 - * Remember to stop watering Dendrobium Nobile and Kingianum <u>now</u>. Only mist plants occasionally to prevent pseudobulbs shrivelling.

APRIL'S ANSWER: Catasetum or Cycnoches.

Catasetum a genus of 70 species from Central & South America. Plants produce inflorescences bearing either male of female flowers. The plants generate colourful male flowers in ideal conditions and bland female blooms are produced when the plant is under stress. The male blooms have an unusual and very fast pollen-ejection mechanism. Catasetums must be watered and fertilized copiously in summer. During winter catasetums have a rest period and should be watered sparingly and fertilizer should be withheld.
