Tracy discussed the most common pests, which attack orchids, including how to identify them and which products and methods to use to best control them.

A FEW MORE TIPS:

- ❖ Jeyes fluid is an excellent deterrent for slugs and snails. Use 30ml to 5 ltrs of water and pour this around your shade house surrounds. Use 15ml to 5 ltrs of water to douse your plant pots.
- ❖ When using a <u>new</u> pesticide, experiment with it on a small group of plants before using it on your entire collection. Ensure that your plants are not sensitive to the new product.
- Pests are much easier to eliminate when their presence is detected early, before they have an opportunity to multiply and spread.
- Correct identification of a pest is very important as misidentification and incorrect treatment can cause further damage to your orchids.
- ❖ Invest the time to determine which pesticide treats the problem most effectively.
