PREVIOUS MEETING – 10 August, 08

APOLOGIES: Colleen Midlane, Norma Murray & Toni Krull.

Members enjoyed a selection of delicious homemade soups and breads while socialising and also taking advantage of the opportunity to purchase top quality plants from Outeniqua Orchids.

What a wonderful tour of Outeniqua Orchids without having to leave Gonubie. Else Hall gave a most informative presentation on her growing area in George and also shared the following tips:

- ❖ Increase humidity in your growing area by watering down your floor and pathways every morning. Other plants such as Ferns, Peace in the Home or Selaginella growing under your benches also helps to increase humidity levels.
- Phragmipediums are best fertilised with Seagro.
- Spray with a fungicide 2-3 times during the summer months as a preventative measure. Funginex, Diathane or Bravo may be used.
- ❖ Bark based growing mediums become very acidic with time and this will affect your orchid's health and also the plants ability to absorb nutrients. Therefore sensitive genera such as Paphiopedilums and Miltoniopsis should be repotted annually, whereas other genera should be repotted every second year.
- ❖ Cattleyas can be encouraged to produce multiple growths by cutting 70% through the rhizome with a razor blade. This should be done early in the growing season i.e. October for best results.
- ❖ When watering your plants it is important to ensure that the water drains away. Your orchids must never stand in water.
- Miltoniopsis from Colombia and Equador grow best in shady spots on the Southern side of a growing area as they require no direct sunlight. They also do not like to dry out and insufficient watering results in pleating of the leaves.
- Lise recommends the following method for pre-treating bark:
 - Soak for one week.
 - Spread out onto shadecloth and wash.
 - Repeat 3 times for best results.
 - Dry bark and add bonemeal and dolomite lime. Use this as a base for your potting medium.
