YOUR COMFORT ZONE Bob & Barbara Groff, FL District

While scanning the newsletters recently I came across an article by **Bill Thomas (FL-1-F2)** where he describes his effort to find a "comfort zone" while cruising down the freeway or negotiating a twisting back country road. Then I started to contemplate about other comfort zones we, as riders and co-riders, need to be aware of to enhance the ride.

Personal comfort: Are you properly dressed for the ride? Did you bring extra clothing? Perhaps a light jacket for early morning or late night rides. Since this is Florida and summer time, how about those rain suits for you and your co-rider. Don't forget the comfort stops.

You know how long you can ride without getting antsy. Plan those rest stops well in advance. Drink plenty of fluids and walk around to keep the limbs loose and while you are at it, check that attitude.

Motorcycle riding is supposed to be fun, that's why we ride. You are not worried about the condition of the bike because you did a **"T-Clock"** before you left. Full fuel and empty bladders make for a great start. Leave your problems at home, where they belong. If you are focused on the problem and not the ride you are likely to miss that car creeping out of the hidden driveway. When you screw up on a motorcycle it usually hurts, and at this age it takes a long time to heal. Proper clothing, a good attitude and a properly maintained motorcycle make for an excellent day. Enjoy the ride.

On another matter... I recently noticed a disturbing trend that seems to be catching on. At a chapter meeting recently, a visiting chapter had a number of trikes present. Not unusual except that there were a lot of trikers riding "*au natural*". I don't mean buck naked and barefoot (although they might as well have been) but lacking even a minor concession to proper riding attire. Sandals, shorts, T-Shirts, and most appalling, **no helmets!**

For some strange reason that baffles me, trike riders seem to feel that being on a trike affords them invincibility against accidents. How did this rumor start? Granted, riders are not likely to "fall" off the bike but they can be thrown off the trike during a crash. Making head contact with an object or the pavement can and does happen to people, whether they ride a motorcycle, a trike or a scooter. We lost a Chapter Director and his spouse a few years ago. Returning from Daytona on their trike, a left turner nailed them. They were not wearing helmets. I realize that our job as Chapter Educators is not to enforce but to inform. Once given the information, intelligent people can make an informed decision. My personal feelings on this matter are simple. If you will not wear the absolute minimum piece of safety equipment (a helmet) then I don't want you to ride with me. You are a risk taker who not only puts yourself at risk, but me as well. I reserve the right to determine whom I ride with. It is your choice.

Why not play it smart and always wear a helmet. See you
