GWRRA Plans Events In 2007 And 2008 To Celebrate 30th Anniversary

Phoenix, Arizona (August 29, 2006)

The Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA) is planning a variety of events and products to celebrate its 30th anniversary.

The special 30th Anniversary logo (above right) will be used throughout the celebration in Association publications and will be featured in a line of collectible GWRRA official merchandise as well.

Events currently being planned to highlight the Association's 30 years as *Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge* include **two international** events (one in Canada, one in Denmark) and **four national events** in various regions of the United States.

The first event planned will be cooperatively staged by GWRRA's Southwest Region (F) and GWRRA's Home Office. The Memorial Day weekend event, scheduled for May 25-28, 2007, is expected to draw large numbers of Gold Wingers to the rally site in Cedar City, Utah.

A few weeks later, GWRRA Regions, Districts and Chapters **worldwide** are being encouraged to simultaneously celebrate the Association's founding date—June 4, 1977—by conducting their own anniversary parties during the weekend of **June 1-3, 2007**.

Wing Ding 29 will bring thousands of Members from all over the world to **Billings, Montana**, for the **July 4-7, 2007**, event for its annual family reunion. Special commemorations are being planned for this event.

In what is anticipated to be an historic weekend, two international GWRRA rallies will be held the same weekend in August. Plans for the first-ever GWRRA sponsored European Wing Ding are being finalized now. This landmark event will be held in **Sakskøbing**, near **Copenhagen**, **Denmark** from **August 2-5**, 2007.

During the same timeframe, the Central Canada Region (K), in cooperation with GWRRA's Home Office, will host an international rally in **London, Ontario, Canada** from **August 3-6, 2007.**

GWRRA will conduct a unique and elegant 30 th Anniversary Labor Day Weekend Party at the Gaylord Opryland Resort in Nashville, Tennessee, from September 1-3, 2007.

Finally, from **February 10-17, 2008**, the 30th Anniversary Cruise and Ride Celebration to the **Caribbean** offers a unique opportunity for up to 35 adventurers to **take their Gold Wing motorcycle** or rent a different brand and actually **enjoy escorted rides on the Caribbean islands** of Puerto Rico and St. Maarten!

Initially announced plans for a 30 th Anniversary Family Reunion, to be held in the spring of 2007 in Phoenix, Arizona, were cancelled in order to concentrate on the other events.

GWRRA, with its motto "Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge," is a not-for-profit organization with over 82,000 Members in 50 countries, and 4,000 volunteer leaders providing rider education and social structure, along with organizing events, rallies, rides and meetings throughout the year. It seems like overnight the weather has changed to fall. And with the changes come some different thoughts on rider safety.

One thing that you will notice is the days are getting shorter. And with the time change just taking place its dark before the six o'clock news comes on. When the sun is just on the horizon it makes it tough riding off into the sunset. Be sure to slow your speed and don't look directly into the sun.

Another thing you will notice is the changing of the leaves. Sure, they're nice to look at and fun to rake into big piles. But, when they are on the payment right after a rain storm its anything but fun. Wet leaves on a wet road will be one of the worst hazards you will ever face while riding a motorcycle.

One thing you probable won't notice and you really should – your tire pressure. In colder weather the pressure will vary differently than in the summer. It takes longer for the tires to heat up while riding. Cold tires have less grip so the correct pressure is even more critical. Especially when you spot those wet leaves in the slick curve.
