RIDER EDUCATION

This month I'm going to discuss something a little different. A lot of folks go camping on their bikes. Whether you pack a tent on your bike or pull a camping trailer, here are some camping safety tips.

- Plan your trip so you arrive with plenty of daylight left to set up your campsite properly. Check over the campsite for glass, broken objects, or hanging branches.
- Check the local weather. Setting up camp in the rain is no fun.
- Let folks back home know your plans.
- Make sure your first-aid kit is up to date. Replace any missing items and check all expiration dates.
- Exercise caution while exploring around your campsite. Poisonous snakes, plants, and ticks can be found along trails.
- Use caution with fire. Never use fire inside a tent. Pay attention to any posted fire alerts.
- Watch out for wildlife. Don't leave inviting items around like food and cooking utensils. Dispose of all trash in proper containers. Remember You're visiting their home.
