We do a lot of traveling on our motorcycles. The likelihood of coming up on an accident is a distinct possibility. In the November issue of *Wing World* there is an article concerning assisting at the crash scene of other motorists.

As you come up on the crash sight, make sure the scene is safe before you approach. Look for low-hanging or downed power lines. Look around for fuel leaks.



Designate someone to call 911. Have others to direct traffic.

Assess the injured. We all should have up to date first aid kits on our bikes. Render first aid as needed.

TIM'S TECH TIP

Keep It Simple Stupid (K.I.S.S.) Part Two



A fellow from Maryland called me out of the Gold Book needing assistance! He was stopping at the rest area on I-85 near our house when his 85 Aspencade just quit running.

He mentioned that he thought it may be the ignition switch.

When we (Ruby, Dad with a trailer, and I) arrived to assist this couple, he had the bike stripped of most of the body work, and had checked and/or rewired several items on the bike.

We asked if he would like a boost to see if it would run. The battery checked at 9 Volts, so we let the car charging system charge the battery for a while and tried the bike, and it started right up. Another check of the battery with the bike running showed low voltage again, indicating a lack of charging from the bikes charging system.

These folks were at the rest area from around 1:30 until probably 7:00, as he checked everything **but** the battery voltage. Moral of the story, **K.I.S.S.**

With the new members list you can contact potential chapter members and invite them to your chapter get-to-gathers. On many occasions new members are unaware that there is a chapter in their area and are just waiting for someone to invite them. The list of expired members can be used to remind members that their membership has or is about to expire. Many members simply overlook their expiration date and appreciate a reminder note, phone call or email. Please don't call a member who is on the do not call list.
