From Your Assistant Chapter Director

A.- There are actually 2 that stand our as my favorites. The first is the trip I took with the group to the South Carolina rally. It was my first trip with the group and we had so much fun that it made me want to do more. The next would be our trip to Nashville to Wing Ding, because everybody in the group got to do something that really interested them and it was also lots of fun.

RIDER EDUCATION





In January I told you to start thinking Top-Gun. Well the reason is on April 19 2008 we are going to have our first Chapter Challenge. We will meet at a location yet to be determined and have an intra-chapter Top Gun competition. You are asking yourselves why should we have a Top Gun competition in the chapter. The GWRRA Top Gun Challenge emphasizes skills needed in riding effectively in many street situations. This has been developed for two reasons:



- To increase survivability on the road through practice of defensive/evasive riding techniques in a controlled environment
- To provide for the fun of competition with fellow riders of similar capability and earn the designation of Top Gun for the Chapter

There are nine professionally developed riding exercises to challenge individual riders to demonstrate their riding skills. Proper execution of these maneuvers will be scored on a points system that will be used to determine the chapter TOP GUN.

For those of you that are interested in participating let me know and I will get you a copy of the Top Gun Handbook. This should be a fun day and also give us the opportunity to practice our riding skills before the riding season gets into full swing.

TIM'S TECH TIP

Randy D. forwarded a portion of Chapter Y's Newsletter to me dealing with problems a lady had after paying for repairs. I'll touch on just one this month. The Lady took her Wing in to have it checked over before a 1200 mile trip. The rear brakes seemed to" stick a little" so that was written up also. The rear brakes locked up 1100 miles into the trip causing the bike and to go down at 50 MPH.

She was charged for the brake work, but found out after the accident that the work was never done. This is a valuable lesson why we should ask to see the old parts. Maybe the repair was over looked or the parts may not have been available, asking to see the old parts may keep this from happening to one of us! We would like to think that we would not intentionally be charged for repairs and parts that were not received. Seeing the old parts and noting how much wear has occurred in a certain amount of miles could help determine when this particular repair may need attention later down the road!

Honda to End Motorcycle Production in Ohio

In July 1996, Honda celebrated the production of the millionth motorcycle at its Marysville factory. Honda will stop making motorcycles in Ohio in 2009 — 30 years after the plant in Marysville became the Japanese company's first manufacturing operation in the United States.



Honda, which announced the move this morning, said it will build the motorcycles at a new plant in Kumamoto, Japan, which will open next year. Along with Marysville, an older plant in Japan will no longer make motorcycles.

"This was a complex decision tied to the important role that Honda in Ohio plays within our North American automobile operations," Akio Hamada, president and chief executive of Honda of America, said in a statement. "We will focus our associates' abilities on our goal to produce cars, light truck and engines in Ohio." No decision has been made about what to do with the 330,000-square-foot motorcycle building, but Honda said it could use it for auto production.

MMP to Cease Production in Spring 2009

This morning I made a very important and difficult announcement to our fellow associates at the Marysville Motorcycle Plant.

Beginning in spring 2009, Honda will consolidate the Marysville Motorcycle Plant production at a new state-of-the-art manufacturing facility in Kumamoto, Japan.

As you may remember, Honda made a similar announcement in 2006 to consolidate motorcycle production from the Hamamatsu plant in Japan to Kumamoto. The purpose of these consolidation efforts is to strengthen the competitiveness and appeal of Honda products by applying advanced technologies.

Out of respect to our associates and those impacted by this announcement, I wanted to share this news as soon as possible. We are currently evaluating how we will proceed with this direction. But I want to assure you that MMP associates will remain an important part of the HAM team. There will be no layoffs.

In the past, many people have identified themselves as motorcycle associates, or auto plant associates, or engine associates. But the one very important thing for all of us to remember is that we are one team. A team of dedicated and committed Honda associates whose number one objective is to satisfy our customers.
