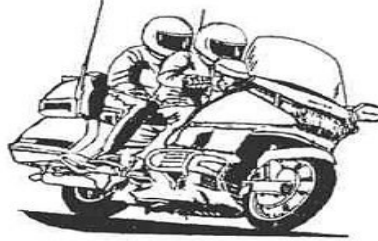

From Your Assistant Chapter Director



This is the third in my series of interviews to get to know our Chapter staff members. So far, I have interviewed our Chapter Couple and our Chapter Educator. This month I interviewed Gary Everhart, our Chapter Treasurer and Goody Sales Person, and here were his replies to my six questions.

- Q 1 & 2. – How long have you been a GWRRA/Chapter NC-A2 member?

A 1 & 2. – Since November of 1997 for both.

- Q3. Why do you stay in NC-A2 and the GWRRA?

A3. I stay because of the nice people, that I enjoy riding with on occasion. It gets me out of the house and doing something fun a few days a month.

- Q4. Why did you accept the positions as Chapter Treasurer/Goody Sales?

A4. Whoever was the Treasurer before him left, and there was nobody else who wanted to do the job. At the time, there weren't as many members in the Chapter to choose from. He felt that he could handle the job, because of his experience with running his own business, so he volunteered. He has had the job for about 6 years now.



- Q5. What do you see as being the responsibilities of your position as Chapter Treasurer/Goody Sales?

A5. For Goody Sales, you simply sell the items (patches, Chapter visitation bars) as people request them. I don't keep many items, so this isn't difficult. As the Treasurer, I collect all of the money that comes in at the meetings and disburse it back out for the 50/50 drawing. I am required to make bank deposits after each meeting, and keep up with the check book. At the end of the year, I have to balance the bank statement and complete an annual financial report that goes to Randy. This takes 3 to 4 hours. He sends it to district, and it eventually ends up at the IRS, so I have to keep accurate records.

- Q6. What is your favorite GWRRA memory, so far?

A6. My favorite memories so far are of the annual picnics that we have at the Parkway (Meadows of Dan). I really enjoy those. I also enjoyed the Wing Ding that I went to in South Carolina.

RIDER EDUCATION

The Challenge



We had our first official Chapter Challenge last weekend, and it went very well. The 16 folks that were there, both riding and watching, had great fun. I would like to say a special thanks to Jim and Gail Simpson from B-2 for acting as the judges. Peggy and I, with some help from Randy, set up the nine Top Gun exercises that Randy, Timmy, AC, and Curry Sprinkle rode through.



I will announce the winner at the next meeting.

I came up with some exercises for trikes as well, and Sonny and Lynn did a great job with what I had. I wouldn't say it was much of a challenge for them, but they did get in some practice. I have since found a few more exercises for the trikes to use in the future, but if anyone else knows of some challenges for trikes that are not dangerous, please, let me know.



As I watched the folks riding through the Challenge exercises, I tried to look at them from my MSF instructor point of view. One of the things I noticed was that they didn't look through the turns enough. When riding at slow speeds, they would often look down at the ground. We as Gold Wing riders have a tendency to get lazy and forget the basics of riding a motorcycle.



I admit, I'm as guilty as the rest. When making a turn, instead of aggressively looking through the turn as we have been taught in every training class that we've attended, we just do it when we remember. When we slow down, instead of keeping our head and eyes up and looking well ahead as we should, we tend to want to see where our front tire is going. I know that you all know that a motorcycle goes where you look. So, if you are having trouble with turns, either slow or fast, try turning your head more, not just your eyes.



Here's a question for you - If you are right handed, do you have more of a problem making right hand turns than left? I am, and I do on occasion. Here is the reason for that problem - If you are right handed 98% of the time you are left eye dominant. That means that your left eye is the controlling eye. It tells your brain the most. When you are making a right hand turn, you are turning away from your dominant eye, so your brain is only getting part of the information, and you get rattled while making the turn. Here is the cure - **TURN YOUR HEAD TO THE RIGHT!** Get that left eye out there were it can see and the right turns won't be any more difficult than turning to the left. Try this while you ride over the next few days and let me know what you think at the meeting.

Even when someone didn't do so well on an exercise, I believe that they learned something from it. It helped them to see their strengths and weaknesses, and discover some areas where they might need more work. What some of us learned is that we can ride very well, until the "judging" starts. Then we forget everything we ever knew! I hope that we can have more of these in the future so that we can become better, safer riders - together.
