This month's featured article comes to us from Andrew & Linda Tanis, CE NC-N

Riding at Night: Now that June is upon us with the weather getting warmer and the days getting longer, it's time to start riding again! With any riding season we all know the inevitable will happen; we will at some point and time be riding at night. Riding at night can pose some new challenges to us as riders we do not normally face in day light riding. But with a few precautions and a little education, we can still have a safe and rewarding ride. Here are some methods that will help you ride safely at night:

Reduce Your Speed - You can't see as well! If something is lying in the road ahead, you may not be able to see it until you are very close to it. If you are going too fast, you may not be able to avoid it. Always drive slower at night than you would during the day-particularly on roads you do not know well. If you have 20/20 vision during the day, you will have the equivalent of 20/200 at night. What you can see at 200 feet during the day can only be seen at 20 feet at night. This is due to medical as well as physical reasons.

Increase Distance - No one can judge distance as well at night as during the day. Your eyes rely greatly upon shadows and light contrasts to judge both how far away an object is and how fast it is coming. These contrasts are missing or distorted under the artificial light available at night. Allow yourself extra distance at night. Open up a three-second following distance and give yourself more distance in which to pass. If it's not enough that your vision is "impaired" by the dark, flashes of light can further cause problems. Anyone who has experienced a car coming at them with the high beams on understands what I'm talking about. This is called a night blind spot. A night blind spot would hide a nail or screw at 3 feet, a dog at 100 feet and a car at 1,000 feet. It helps if you do not look directly into the bright light. Instead, avoid the light for more than a second or two and slowly scan from side to side.

-Given this information, the problem we all face at night is that we override the headlight. Simply stated, it will take you a longer to stop than the distance your headlight illuminates. Stopping distance is the time it takes to react plus the time it takes to actually stop. The response time for and average rider is one half (1/2) second. The following are stopping distances:

Initial Speed (mph)	35	45	55	65	75	85
Distance to react (ft)	26	33	40	48	55	62
Distance to stop (ft)	65	106	157	218	289	414



Tim's Tech Tip



We all know we should check our tire pressures before riding our Wings. Now it is time of the year that we may be taking longer overnight trips. So do not forget to check those pressures each day while traveling. Recently while on a long trip I was checking tire pressures in the parking deck before the return trip. For some reason the gauge would not seat properly on the valve stem, resulting in a loss of air pressure. A better plan is to check the tires on the bike and trailer at a nearby Gas Station so the tires will be cool and have handy source of compressed air if needed.

There was an article in the Davidson Reporter about the Pastor's Pantry.

A food shortage at a regional food bank is having ripple effects in Davidson County. Pastor's Pantry was shocked earlier this month when it learned the stock at Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwest North Carolina in Forsyth County – where the local agency receives or purchases about 50 percent of the food it distributes to senior citizens here – was very low.

"We're down 600,000 pounds in receiving food from the grocery stores and the government's emergency food assistance program." Second Harvest Food Bank.
