Risk, Webster's defines it as "The possibility of suffering harm". It is something we live with every day from the time we get up until we lay down again at night. We can't avoid it but we can try to manage it. When deciding to participate in motorcycling you are agreeing to accept a certain amount of risk over and above what you normally deal with. But there are techniques we can use to manage that risk to an acceptable level.

We have already begun to manage the risk by participating in the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) Basic Rider Course (BRC) where we learned strategies and techniques to keep us safe and minimize the risk. The MSF class teaches you where to look and what to look for as well as what actions to take when you recognize a potentially dangerous situation. But, formally trained or not, we all use strategies every time we ride in order to manage the risk.

For years I have said I ride "as if everyone else on the road was put there with the sole purpose to run over me". That is a strategy; even though it is very broad and very open ended it is still a strategy that governs the way I ride and how I manage risk. When on my motorcycle I trust no one and expect other vehicle operators to do the unexpected. I try to imagine what is the worst thing they could do, and then plan on it happening. Each of us should have our own strategy. If you don't have one your motorcycling career may be very short.

MSF teaches a very simple strategy called SEE. It stands for Search, Evaluate, and Execute. It is a simple but effective way to protect yourself from the many risks that exist on the open road. They also teach you to scan at a distance of 12 seconds, and 4 seconds and maintain a minimum following distance of 2 seconds. Again, a strategy to help you manage the risk. Can we always manage the risk to the point of avoiding all accidents?

Accidents are a series of events that end in a crash. Sometimes these are single vehicle accidents and sometimes there are multiple vehicles involved. If any of the events leading up to the crash could be eliminated then the crash could have been avoided. Most crashes are avoidable by simply managing the risk and eliminating events that lead to a crash.

If you get on your motorcycle immediately after a fight with your significant other you won't be focused on your riding. Your mind will be playing back the argument and you might not notice the car backing out of the driveway until it is to late to avoid a collision. By not allowing yourself to ride when you are less than 100% focused on your riding you are applying a strategy, which allows you to interrupt a series of events that may result in a crash.

Wearing the proper protective clothing is another way of managing the risk. You see riders, usually at the beach, with no helmet, no shirt, shorts and sandals. This type of rider has accepted a level of risk far greater than anything I'm willing to accept and one that could easily lead to significant injury or death. Proper gear not only protects you from the environment it makes you more visible and may save your life when all else fails.

Many automobile operators claim they never saw the motorcycle they just pulled out in front of. Could this risk have been managed? Yes, by wearing high visibility gear, adding a headlight modulator and driving lights you can make your motorcycle easier to see. Additionally, the frontal cross section of a motorcycle is very small making it difficult for a driver to judge the approach speed of the motorcycle. The best way to manage this one is to slow down in congested areas and stay with-in the speed limit.

No matter how you attempt to manage the risk there are times that you do everything right and it still results in a crash situation. Good equipment, good training, and good sense will keep most of us out of trouble most of the time but not always and that is the risk that we take every time we ride. Doing everything right may not be enough because as a friend of mine says there are times when you can be right, dead right. Ride safe and when you drive, look twice you might save a life.

### Pastor's Pantry relocates to new building

The Pastor's Pantry has moved to a larger facility at 307 N. State St. in <u>Lexington</u> to reach its objective to serve more financially challenged senior adults needing nutritious groceries.

The significant increase in square footage at the State Street facility provides a long-term home for the organization, provides an extensive area to store food items and allows more room for volunteers to gather as they process the groceries. NewBridge Bank donated furniture for the office, and members of First Baptist Church on West Third Avenue built storage shelves.

The former office was broken up into small rooms, hampering large volunteer groups from being able to gather for projects. The new warehouse has larger rooms for food storage and volunteer gatherings.

"The most important thing is this will allow us to grow," Executive Director Jo Ann Poston said.

The pantry will acknowledge the support of the community and their volunteers by hosting an open house from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 23. Attendees can eat a hot dog and help "Pack the Pantry" shelves by donating food items.

The food items needed by The Pastor's Pantry include the following canned items: mixed vegetables, carrots, peas, tuna and meat. In addition, the pantry needs rice, elbow macaroni, spaghetti and individual packets of oatmeal and grits.

Serving its clients is the most important priority for the Pastor's Pantry, therefore, all grocery distributions for the month of July were processed prior to the move. With the exception of receiving donations, the State Street location will be closed for the remainder of July as the staff and volunteers prepare the location for a more timely and efficient method of serving clients.

The <u>Davidson County</u> Sheriff's Office allowed inmates in the <u>Davidson County</u> Detention Center to help move the office Monday, for which Poston said she was grateful.
