Practice Continued

Last month we talked about how important it is for us to practice riding a motorcycle. Not just going for rides, but really practicing. Understanding how you and your bike will react in certain situations is critical for both your and your co-rider's safety.

To make sure that everybody has an opportunity to practice, we will have a chapter safety day. The day will start at our house, in Mocksville, at 9:30 AM on Saturday, November 8th. I have talked to the folks at Davidson County Community College and have reserved the use of the motorcycle range on the Davie Campus in Mocksville.

What will we do? I will be setting up many of the life saving exercises from the ERC for you to practice. **If you normally ride with a co-rider, please consider having them ride these with you.** I will have exercises for both two and three wheeled machines. We will set up the swerve, the braking chute, and the turning exercises to begin with, and let you practice them. I will also set up any other exercise you might care to work on. Remember, this day is for **you** to practice **your** skills, so any weak area that you have is a good one for practice. I know some of you might be a little embarrassed to admit that you have a problem with a particular area of riding but, I would rather you admit it now than to tell me about it in the hospital when I come to visit after an accident. Besides, most other riders have the same problem areas.

My hope for this day is that we will share information with each other. I won't be there as an MSF instructor, I will be there as a member of A-2, trying to improve my skills on the bike, just like you. I hope we can share our knowledge and experience (some learned the hard way), with our fellow members so that they can learn from our past mistakes.

We will ride for a few hours, and then we will return back to our house for some safety discussions. Some of the subjects we would like to discuss are Group Riding, Co- riders, Clothing, Trailering, and Riding Alone. I would appreciate it if each of you that plan to attend would think about these topics before you come. I don't want this day to be about me giving information to you. It's about us, exchanging our ideas and experiences as fellow riders and co-riders. Everybody's input is welcome and will be respected and valued.

After the discussions, we will recap the day and then get to my favorite part - the food. That's Peggy's department so I will leave those details to her. I hope to see you all there.

Tim's Tech Tip



This is Part Two of the fuel saving tips I started last month. Some of these tips were in the October issue of Rider Magazine, and others I used some time back in a Tech Tip on this same subject.



- Synch the carbs (If your bike has carbs)-This allows all the cylinders to receive the same fuel- air mixture, thus using less fuel.
- Be smooth with your throttle inputs. Also, do not "blip" the throttle, this just waste fuel.
- Use the motorcycle instead of the car to run errands.
- Use the proper octane fuel for your bike, per your Owners Manuel.
- Unload the excess weight from motorcycle. It takes more fuel to haul the extra load.
