Where Do Your Contributions Go?

By Lisa Pierce, CPA - Chief Financial Officer / Hospice of Davidson County

As the Chief Financial Officer for Hospice of Davidson County, I often get asked questions about the cost of our services,

how they are paid for and where exactly contributions go. To help our supporters better understand how we bill for services and manage costs, I'll address a few of the most commonly asked questions.

Q: Is my contribution tax deductible?

A: Yes. Hospice of Davidson County (HODC) is a 501(c)(3), Not-for-Profit agency and all donations are taxdeductible.

Q: How does HODC get paid for the services they offer?

A: HODC does not turn anyone away due to inability to pay. If a patient has Medicare, Medicaid or private insurance, in

most cases HODC can bill these third parties directly. For our patients without any form of insurance or the ability to pay –

we are able to provide our services due to the financial support of our community and the funds raised at annual events

such as our annual "Ride for Angles" bike ride, summer golf

tournament and the August Gala. This year we also plan to offer our first annual Christmas ornament sale.

Q: Do we receive financial support from United Way?

A: Yes. We are a United Way agency that applies for funding each year. We also apply for grants when we qualify. Q: If I make a donation or attend a fund raiser, how are the funds used?

A: All monies donated or raised on our behalf go directly to our patients, their families and to the programs and services

provided by our agency. Some of these include: Hospice Home Care – which enables terminally ill patients to stay at home and still receive quality care. Hospice pays for medications related to the hospice diagnosis, medical equipment and

supplies.

Hinkle Hospice House - offering a home-like setting where hospice care can be provided when a situation arises that

prohibits a patient from staying at home.

Bereavement – counseling services, bereavement programs and support groups that assist families through the grieving

process.

Indigent Care – with our declining economy, more and more families have suffered job losses and consequently the loss

of insurance coverage. Each year more patients are in need of hospice care but do not have the means to pay for it. Due to your gracious support, everyone can receive hospice care regardless of their ability to pay.

Protective Gear

I was directing traffic at the ride for angels when I started watching the riders as they came in and was looking at the way they were dressed. I would never tell anyone how to dress when riding, that is a choice you have to make, and I spent a great part of my life defending your right to choose. However, being the chapter educator and a safety geek, I do have to tell you what I think. You can use the information as you see fit.

I saw people coming into the park and going on the ride in such a wide variety of attire that it would be impossible to mention them all, but here are a few. I saw people on many brands of bikes not wearing helmets as they came into the parking area. Though this was completely legal because we were on private property, was it safe???? I also saw tank tops and shorts of various types being worn, along with a variety of flimsy foot ware. I can only assume they have never experienced a close encounter of the asphalt kind.

The MSF has determined that proper riding gear consists of Six items. They are:

- 1) A DOT approved helmet to protect your head and brain from injury.
- 2) Eye protection such as a face shield or goggles to protect your eyes from wind and debris.
- **3)** Full fingered gloves to increase grip, reduce fatigue, and protect your hands from the elements. You can also ask Bill Plyler how they work while sliding down the highway at 50 plus miles an hour
- 4) A long sleeved shirt to protect you from the sun and to provide some protection in a fall. I would also recommend a long sleeved jacket with armor to provide maximum protection.

Yes I know, I can hear some of you saying that that would be too hot in the summer time. You are right, when it gets above 90 degrees the vented jacket does become a little uncomfortable, but it will sure help protect you from road rash and broken bones.

5) Long pants are the fifth component of this protective gear we have discussed. They protect you from the sun, heat from the bike, things kicked up by the front tire and that close encounter thing we discussed earlier.

6) Last but not least, above the ankle boots will protect you from the heat of the bike and I can profess to their usefulness in protecting you from major injury, just ask me some time.

Ok I will get off my soap box because for most of you, I am preaching to the choir. This is for the few of you who believe that a close encounter of the asphalt kind only happens to others. All I can say is, I hope that continues to work for you. As always, ride safe!
