"This section of THE SPOOKY MOVIE FILM FESTIVAL will be a midnight *rounder vous* between Avant Garde Minimalism and a Hallucinogenic Hokum String Band," Bobo promises. "So don't forget to bring your ears to this special, not so silent, silent film. SHHH!!!"

Relentless appearances and self-promotion on the radio and the internet, as well as live performances in Baltimore, Cleveland, New York City's Hard Rock Café, and an upcoming Prague music festival, Bobo continues to fulfill the promise of his over 25 year career of creating music for performance, movies and art.
