Green iguanas can grow to up to six feet in length and can weigh up to 20 pounds!

Female green iguanas can lay eggs even without the presence of a male iguana.

Green iguanas have special light, temperature, diet and humidity requirements for good health.

Male green iguanas can become aggressive during breeding season and breeding season can last for several months.

Almost all baby green iguanas have intestinal parasites and need to see a qualified reptile vet for special medicine to correct this problem. Green iguanas need to have fecal samples tested regularly to keep the gut beasties in check!

Green iguanas can be “potty trained” to use the bathtub or a pan of water to take care of their bathroom habits.
