

ANNE BARTLEY

Anne was born in the Townland of Tievemore, Parish of Templecarne, in the County of Donegal, on April 4, 1829 and baptized on April 19, 1829. She was the youngest known child of Joseph and Jane Bartley.

That she emigrated to Canada with the family is certain. The 1842 census listed an unmarried female in the 5-13 age group and the 1848 census, one in the 15-45 age group. The other members of the family have been accounted for on both of those occasions so it is certain that the person is Anne. She was a sponsor at the baptism of William, one of Sarah's children, on November 17, 1845 and she was mentioned in her father's will which he prepared in July 1851 when she would have been 22 years old but otherwise there is no information about her; she disappeared as completely as her sister, Jane, and her parents.

At least in the case of Jane it is possible to speculate that upon her (likely) early death she was buried in the Clothier plot in a Kemptville cemetery. Research carried out by a Clothier descendant did not disclose any evidence of Jane except for her marriage to Solomon. In Anne's case, it is not even known whether she married although, had she not, there is a chance that her death would have been recorded in the Kemptville Anglican registers, although her parent's deaths are not.
