LOUISA REDDICK

Louisa was born on February 6, 1858, on lot four, concession four, Marlborough township, Carleton county, Ontario, the seventh of fourteen children of James Reddick and Matilda Goldie. She was baptised in the North Gower Anglican church on August 24, 1865, one of four sisters privately baptised on the same day.

Her older brother, Robert, established a medical practice in Winchester. Ontario, in 1875. Louisa went to keep house for him and, while there, worked with Alex Cameron, a tailor. She and Alex were married, probably before 1880 since the 1881 census of Winchester recorded Alexander, from Scotland, age 28, Louisa, age 24, and Donald R., age 1. The 1891 census recorded the following family group:
