

AGNES REDDICK

Agnes, a daughter of John and Margaret Reddick, was born on February 20, 1866 and baptised in the North Gower Presbyterian church on April 4, 1866.

On December 28, 1898 Agnes, age 31, married George Robert Davis, age 26. George was born at Manotick, the son of Simon Davis and Lavina Harris. Lavina is thought to have been the daughter of Robert Harris of lot 19, concession 1, Oxford-on-Rideau township, Grenville county. The witnesses were Nelson Reddick (her brother) and Maggie Reddick (thought to have been the daughter of John Reddick, of the Burritts Rapids branch of the family) Agnes was the bridesmaid for her sister Eliza when she married Joseph Bartley.

Little is known of George and Agnes after their marriage. By May 3, 1901 they were in Saskatchewan since there was an entry in George's name for SW 16, township 15, range 15, W2. Her brothers, John and Robert, filed for two quarters of the same section. This was abandoned on January 10, 1902 when he was "unable to perform the duties at present" and an entry recorded on the property for John Hart on February 2. John Hart had been a neighbour of the Reddicks in Marlborough township. In 1909 they were visited in Kemptville by "Yennie" Reddick of Aitkin, Minnesota and in 1910 he was elected to an office in Kemptville L.O.L. #334.

When her mother died in 1926 and when her brother John died in 1936 and in 1947, at the time of the golden wedding of her sister Elizabeth, she was in Vancouver.

Martha (Leach) Ganion has said that George and Agnes lived on Lula Island, B.C., where Robert Reddick and Susie and Clarence Leach also lived. She believes that George died about 1947/48 and Agnes a few years later. There were no children of this marriage.
