ROBERT REDDICK

Robert was not among those listed with the Daniel and Mary Reddick group as emigrants from County Derry in 1834. It is only because he was one of the sons named by Daniel Reddick as beneficiaries under his will in 1866 that he has been identified as a member of the family. There is no evidence that he came to Canada either in 1834 or later.

The Daniel Reddick family emigrated from the townland of Ballygruby in the parish of Artrea in County Derry. The 1831 census of that townland listed Robert Ridagh, a Presbyterian in a family group of nine persons. There is nothing to identify this Robert Ridagh as Daniel's son.

In 1859, Griffith's Valuation listed Robert Reddock in Ballygruby, leasing a house, offices and land from the Worshipful Company of Drapers. Again, it would only be speculation to associate this person with Daniel Reddick.

All of this only indicates that after Daniel left the townland, there were Reddicks (however spelled) who remained there.
