NEW PROJECTOR

The Central Iowa Camera Club recently purchased a digital projector. Based on the investigation of a knowledgeable member of the Minnesota Valley Photography Club, a BenQ model PB6200 was recommended.

Ken Johnson verified through other sources and web reviews that this was a highly rated projector and was the best value available. What made it so attractive was its 1700 lumen brightness, XGA (1024x768) resolution, and free spare bulb rebate (a \$399 value). The projector was priced at \$1,499.99 plus shipping.

The projector was delivered in time for demonstration at the June 10 CICC meeting. Several members furnished a variety of images to demonstrate the projector's capabilities. Members agreed that the color and sharpness of the images was outstanding, and everyone was well pleased with the quality.

2004 N4C CONVENTION NOTES

Linda and Robert Scarth from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, gave and excellent talk and slide show about the wonders of nature. They both have been serious photographers for the past 20 years. They had lived in Australia for seven years before coming to live in Iowa. They had not planned to live there permanently, but they liked everything about Iowa and decided to stay.

They use 50 or 100 Fuji film, but not for long—a complete Canon digital camera outfit will be delivered to their home on Tuesday after the convention. There is a saying that goes, it is easier to turn a naturalist into a nature photographer, than to turn a photographer into a nature photographer.

They both tend to agree with that statement.

Tom Boysen, a dermatologist from Coralville, Iowa, for the past 17 years, has been an underwater photographer for the past five years. In 9th grade he was the school photographer plus he was on the swim team. It was just natural to take up scuba diving, which he did 10 years ago. His wife Roxanne also scuba dives, but does not do underwater photography.

He showed us beautiful photos of fish and coral from various places around the world. The slide show consisted of underwater shots from the Caribbean, Central America, Grand Cayman Island and Hawaii. He said the British Virgin Islands, in his opinion, is the prettiest place on earth. Around every turn the scenery looks like a postcard.

Tom uses a manual Nikonos and a flash unit. The Nikonos is made from cast iron, rubber "O" rings and screws. It is not a matter of time if a camera will flood, but when. He has had one camera flood already. His photos are taken at a 3-5 foot range at 80 to 95 feet down.

He would like to go to the coral reef of the coast of Australia, but with teenage sons at home and a wife who doesn't want him to go, he won't be going there for awhile anyway. Clay Smith, a DNR employee for the state of Iowa, travels to the four corners of the state doing video and still photography. He started his photography career when he was 12 years old and there was a big snow storm in Des Moines, Iowa. He used his mother's Instamatic camera to capture the big snow banks and the snow plows coming through the town.

He has had many ups and downs during his career, including selling his favorite camera to stay alive. He would work for the State of Iowa for nothing, but the State insists on paying him for what he enjoys doing so much.

Some of the places Clay recommended for shooting was Dunning Springs outside Decorah, the Quaker Mill upstream from Manchester, and the waterfalls at Beeds Lake.

Dr. Chuck Huss has attempted Mount Everest three times. He has been close to the top, but hasn't made it yet. He plans on trying again in 2006.

To climb Mount Everest you need to make an application to the country of Nepal at a cost of \$10,000. The climb can only be done at a certain time of year, April 1st until May 15th. 1,000 people pay the fee to climb and 250 climbers make it.

There are five members to a team. It cost \$40,000 for supplies to make the climb if you put the supplies together, \$70,000 if someone else does it. Dr. Huss sent over 1500 pounds of food for the trip.

He has been to the 4th level two times, which is 100 feet from the Summit. Dr. Huss got very ill both times when he was so close to the summit.

A Shirpa native from Nepal who assists on these trips has been to the summit 14 times.

Dr. Huss told the story of a man who reached the summit, reached for his digital camera and the battery failed. Chuck said, "I use a manual camera so I don't have to worry about my camera not failing."
